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

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### 前 言

《走遍美国初级教程》(原名:Free Time)是美国麦克米伦出版公司于 1991年 8月制作的。它适用于从未学过英语以及具有一定基础但渴望快速巩固所学知识的英语初学者。本教程分为 A、B、C、D、E、F 六个部分,每个部分下设若干个单元。课文内容取自真实的语言素材,在整体安排上遵循由浅入深、精讲多练的原则,因而是一部理想的初学者教程。

本教程所教的是纯正的美语发音。初学者可以根据本教程提供的录像带和录音带跟随发音人练习标准的美语发音。

本教程提供的基本词汇、句型、语法知识以及对话情景都是日常生活中出现频率最高的。因此,当你学完了这一教程之后,你已经获得了初步的交际能力,将能以良好的美语语音语调、地道的表达方式在日常生活以及各种社交场合跟美国人进行简单的交际,并为学习《走遍美国》中级教程(FAMILY ALBUM, U.S. A.)打下良好的基础。

为了巩固所学内容,本教程在每个部分之后,都配备了综合复习题,内容涉及词汇、句型、语法知识等。复习题后面附有答案,初学者可作为自我测试的参考。

在外语学习的初级阶段,强记单词,机械地操练句型是单调的、枯燥的,它容易引起疲劳并在初学者心里诱发厌倦的情绪。为了克服这一现象,教程的设计特别注意到了内容的生动、节奏的明快并把学习英语自然地融入了音乐、动画、幽默和美国实际生活的场景中,使你如有身临其境之感。因此,本教程在带给你英语的交际能力的同时,必定还会给你带来乐趣和欢笑,并介绍你认识新的朋友——《走遍美国》主人
