编写说明

毛主席教导我们:"路线是个纲,纲举目张。"坚持以党的基本路线为纲,继续深入批林批孔,批判修正主义,批判资产阶级,努力做到革命性、科学性、实践性相结合,有利于转变学员思想,有利于学员学好英语,有利于学员将来的工作实践,为无产阶级政治服务,这是编写本册教材的指导思想。

第三册教材的内容如下:

- 1. 课文和听读材料的题材结合当前国际国内阶级斗争、路线斗争的实际,反映我国社会主义革命和社会主义建设的成就,特别是无产阶级文化大革命和批林批孔运动的胜利成果,反映社会主义蓬勃发展的新生事物。内容力求有利于开门办学,紧密结合三大革命运动的实践。全册共十二课,适当留有余地,各校可根据形势发展及开门办学等需要增编材料。
- 2. 按题材分为六个单元,每个单元两课,内容相互联系。 第一至第四单元,每两个单元有一个阶段复习;第五、第六个单 元之后有总复习。
- 3. 语音、语法理论的讲解仍采用归纳的方法,基本内容在本册内介绍完毕。由于词汇逐渐丰富,本册的词汇工作较第二册有所加强,在课文前的口头机械性练习中增加词汇练习,并改称"句型和词汇练习";每课增设"词汇学习"一项,对常用词语的用法进行归纳练习。本册的词汇量约为 650 个。
- 4. 继续突出听、说,同时加强读和写的训练。每课的"句型和词汇练习"可采用各种口头方式灵活使用。在综合性练习中,笔头练习的比重有所增加。每个单元结束后,要求一次笔头作文。由于二年级一般都设口语课,课文前不再安排小对话。
 - 5. 根据"古为今用,洋为中用"的原则,在本册中选用了

- 一些原文,作为课文和听读材料,并以注释方式提供了有关的背景知识。对于有局限性的文章,作了简单评注,供教师、学员分析批判时参考。
- 6. 为了更好地培养学员耳听会意的能力, 听读材料另编成册, 作为附件。

第三册教材的编写工作得到工农兵群众和兄弟院校的工农兵 学员、教师的热情支持和帮助,我们在这里表示衷心的感谢。

由于我们学习很不够,对毛泽东思想领会不深,这本教材一定还存在不少缺点错误,希望同志们提出批评意见。
