

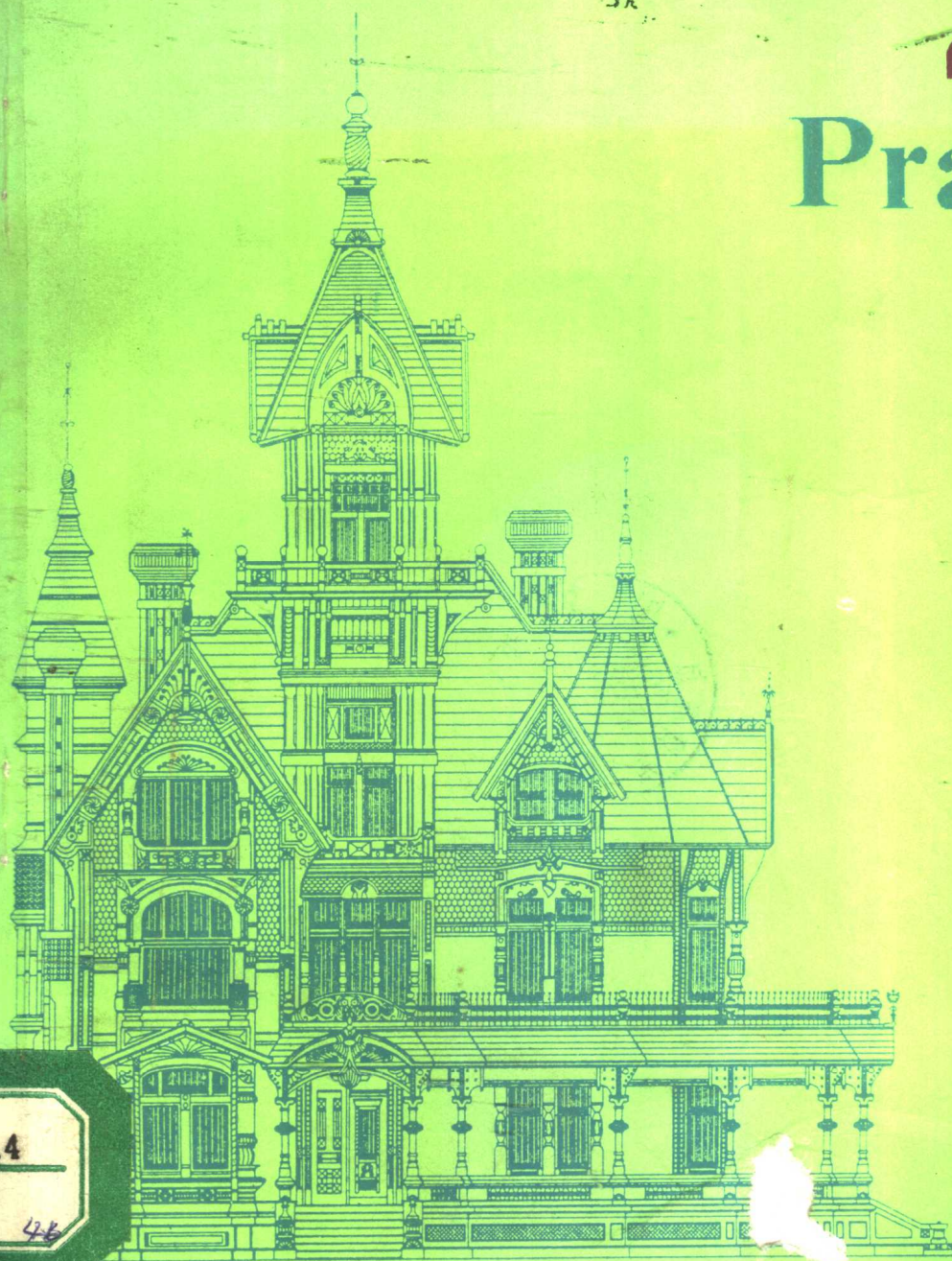

前 言

English Through Reading 是外国人编写的一本英语阅读教材，目前我国使用很广。许多外语学院英语系学生、英语专业大专班、英语脱产进修班、英语出国培训班、英语师资培训班、理、工、农、医各类高等院校尖子班、高年级学生与研究生班都使用 *English Through Reading* 作为必读的英语精读教材。

本教材共收集了二十篇文章，题材广泛，语言流畅，哲理概念严紧，具有当代英语文字的代表性。该教材循序渐进，由浅入深，深入浅出，具有一定的难度，可供读者深入分析阅读，读后发人深思。该教材文字优美，段落清晰，主题鲜明，结构紧凑，适于开展篇章教学，因此受到各校广大师生青睐，多年来一直用而不舍。

但该教材练习形式陈旧，与目前流行的考题的题型相差太远，不适合当前英语教学的发展和学生应试的需要，为此编写了 *English Through Reading Practice* 这本辅助练习册，以期帮助读者巩固课文中的主要语言点、句型结构与常用词语（特别是五、六级词），并可训练和培养学生适应和通过各种英语测试的能力。本练习册中的词汇练习 I 几乎概括了本教材中出现的全部五、六级单词，并在该题序号前用“Δ”标出，以引起读者注意。

该练习册的练习编排次序为 I. Multiple Choice; II. Identification; III. Vocabulary 1, Vocabulary 2. 的要求是：在一个英语句子中留有一处空白，用该句后面括号中所给词的适当形式填空。

为便于课堂教学，特将本练习册的全部答案，以附页形式装订在书后，教员可先取出，待学员做完练习后再发。

该练习册中的全部练习题都由美籍英语教师 Natarajan Kottayam Jr. 审阅修改，赵福胤副教授和杨云峰副教授，提出了极其宝贵的修改意见，特此表示谢意。由于编者水平有限，时间仓促，缺点错误在所难免，恳请同行及读者批评指正。
