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前 言

为了迎接 21 世纪的挑战,大学英语教学要再上一个新台阶,以 适应国民经济和社会发展的需要,适应高等教育深化改革、培养跨世 纪人才的需要,高等学校本科用《大学英语教学大纲》(修订本)于 1999年5月颁布实行。该大纲对学生读、听、说、写、译等能力的要 求都有了明显的、较大幅度的提高,对听的能力比以前也有了更高的 要求。如,对基础阶段的基本要求(即四级)是"能听懂英语授课,并 能听懵题材熟悉、句子结构比较简单、基本上没有生词、语速为每分 钟 130~150 词的简短会话、谈话、报道和讲座,掌握其中心大意,抓 住要点和有关细节,领会讲话者的观点和态度"。历年统考情况表 明,听力理解部分一直是学生的薄弱环节,学生在基础语音听力理 解、基础词汇辨识、惯用表达法的掌握以及逻辑思维、有效记忆和语 言的总体敏感性等诸多方面均存在不同程度的不足。究其原因,主 要是缺乏经常的、大量的、系统的、有针对性的练习。 在这些方面,与 教学和测试密切相关的听力理解辅导材料不多,高质量的、规范的录 音磁带更是少见。为了帮助同学们平时练习和突破应试难关,我们 编写了《大学英语四级听力理解考试模拟题集》这本书。

本书包括大学英语四级国家统一考试听力理解部分的全部题型,即对话(Conversation)、短文(Passages)、听写填空(Spot Dictation)和复合式听写(Compound Dictation)。本书共有10套模拟试题,每套试题均由上述四种题型组成,而国家考试只择其中两种题型,而且每次统考前不公布其所测试的题型,本书每套试题均包括所有题型的目的是突出其实用性,使同学们做全面和充分的准备,取得理想的成绩。

本书选材广泛、新颖。既注重实用性和针对性,也兼顾到知识性 和趣味性,以提高同学们的学习兴趣和练习效果。

本书录音磁带严格按照教学大纲要求精心录制,由美籍专家朗读,语音纯正,朗读规范,语速标准(前5套试题语速每分钟130词,后5套试题每分钟150词)。

教学法与测试学的研究永无止境,由于编者缺乏经验,书中疏漏、不妥之处实为难免,我们诚恳地希望读者多加批评指正,俾使此书渐臻完善。
