编者的话

英语学科高考试题的命题已经将考查重点从语言知识转向语用能力,这个转变是命题 思想务实和成熟的标志。我们讲,学外语主要是为了应用外语。那么,怎么去应用外语呢? 可以肯定地说,绝大多数的英语学习者将来既不会经常需要用外语与外国人进行口头交流, 更不可能专门去从事口译工作,主要地还是为了从那些用外文写的书、报刊、资料中获取所 需要的信息。而这种获取信息的过程便是阅读理解外文的过程。也正因为这一点,英语学 科高考试题的命题对"阅读理解"这一项比以往更加重视了,不仅题量增多,难度增大,而且 分值也提高了。与此同时,就二〇〇一年的高考成绩来看,阅读理解的得分率却难以令人满 意。有关调查统计数据表明,此项的平均得分率也就在 50%上下徘徊。一些考生惊呼:阅 读理解题太难了!

通过对二〇〇一年全国高考英语试题中"阅读理解"题的反复研究,我们认为,根本的问题不是试题太难,而是考生本身在应对高考试题的转变方面准备不足。这些不足主要表现为:1.思想上准备不足。不少考生平时对"阅读理解"训练在认识上就存在偏差。相当一部分考生认为把时间花在"阅读理解"训练上不值得,错误地认为只要记得住单词、看得懂语法结构,就能基本上保证答题的80%的正确率。这显然是战略上的过分轻"敌"。兵家克敌制胜之道,便是"不打无准备之仗"。如此轻"敌",怎能胜算?2.行动上准备不足。有些考生在考前虽然也做了一些阅读理解方面的训练,但是在训练的过程中却暴露了一些不足,如阅读理解训练的量不够多,阅读材料本身的难度不够适中,阅读材料的体裁不够全面,阅读理解材料的题材不够广泛。3.解题技巧、方法上缺乏指导。有些考生在考前做了大量阅读理解训练,但是在做题的过程中不善于进行分析和总结,又缺乏解题技巧、方法上的必要指导,更没有进行限时阅读训练,因此到了高考解题时面对语境应用、综合分析、逻辑推理的试题,往往感到模棱两可、似是而非、真伪难辨,而且费时过多,甚至占用了本该花在解答其他试题的时间。

有鉴于此,为切实帮助即将参加高考的学生迅速提高英语阅读理解能力,我们编写了这 本《高考英语阅读理解训练及解析》。这本书是"备战中考高考英语丛书"中的一本重要的单 项训练分册。本书中的阅读理解文章的题材多样,涉及到农业、工业、科技、军事、经济、教 育、文化、医疗卫生、体育、人口、环境、历史、地理、交通、通讯、风土人情、人文轶事等,有些题 材还极具有时代感,如举世瞩目的"9·11 事件"、国人普遍关注的"北京申奥成功"和"中国加 入 WTO"及"中国足球冲出亚洲"等热门话题都收入了本书,并且兼顾了高考命题中可能会 出现的各种体裁。本书不仅给出了各篇练习的参考答案,而且对一些难度较大的习题还在 "难题解析"中给予了较为详尽的解答与指导。这些解答与指导实际上具有解题策略与技巧 的功能,这也是全书的重点。我们希望,这么做能对正在复习迎考的考生有所启发和帮助。 同时,我们还建议考生能养成良好的阅读习惯,坚持每天做一、二篇阅读理解练习,加强限时 阅读训练。我们坚信,苍天不负苦心人。

Suppose you are reading a book. Suppose, too, you suddenly close your eyes. Can you still see the book? "Of course not," you will say. But can you tell why? You would probably say, "When I close my eyes, my eyesight cannot get out of my eyes to get to the book." But this explanation is wrong.

You cannot see any object unless light from that object gets into your eyes. Some of the things you see give off light of their own. The sun, the stars, a lighted lamp are examples that can be seen by their own light. Such things are <u>luminous</u>. Most of the things you see are not giving off light of their own. They are simply reflecting light that falls on them from the sun or some other luminous body. The moon, for example, does not give off any light of its own. It is nonluminous. You see it because sun light falls on it and some of the light reflects in your direction. So moonlight is only second-hand sun-light.

When you look at a book, it sends to your eyes some of the light which falls on it, and you see the book. If light could kept out from where you are so that there would be no light for the book to reflect, then you could not see the book even with your eyes wide open.

Light travels so fast that the time in which it travels from the book you are reading to your eyes is so short as if there were no time at all. Light reaches us from the moon, which is about 380,000 kilometres away, in only a little more than a second.
