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# 大学英语等级考试指南

第二册

(供六级考试用)

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根据高校外语教学大纲规定,高校英语水平划分为六级。国家教委决定对其中的四级和六级进行全国统一考试。凡四级或六级及格者国家予以承认,并由国家教委颁发单科合格证书。四级全国统考从1987年开始,六级统考从1989年开始,每年分别进行一次,借以检查学生英语学习成绩和学校教学水平,促进全国高校英语水平的不断提高。大学英语四级统考虽已举办两次,但迄今为止国内尚缺这方面的辅导材料,大学英语六级统考将于1989年举行,但也面临着同样问题,缺少与之相应的辅导书籍。为此我们根据高校英语教学大纲的规定与统考的要求,参照了国外各种测试用书,并结合多年来的实践,编写了这套与大学生的学习深度及考试类型相适应的等级考试指南。

本书分一、二兩册,第一册供大学英语四级考试用;第二册供六级考试用。每册汇编二十套模拟考题。第一册每 套 题 的 内容包括;词汇、语法结构、改错、阅读理解和综合填充 五 个 方面,题量大,内容丰富、针对性强。每题均有答案、详细的注释以及应掌握的要点等。其中词汇部分,在注释中有词义比较与鉴别。经统计有二百组,计七百多常用同义词得到区别,这是学生学习英语的难点所在,也是目前各类"水平测试"等书籍中所没有的。在语法结构和改错项目中也有大量的语法注释,读者掌握这些就可举一反三。在阅读理解一题中,每题四篇短文,内容上

既有科学文化知识,又有名人轶事、新闻、社会生活与故事等方方面面,有易有难。

第二册每套考题除第一册的五个方面之外,另加听力和作文两项。听力部分共计二十套题,包括七十五个短文。在前十五套题中,每套有四篇短文,计二十个听力选择题。在后五套题中,每套听力部分是三篇较长一点的短文,计十五个听力选择题。该中无单句和两人对话,一是因为六级考试起点高,另一方或商时,是因为六级考试起点高,另一方或市场,并在书后附有录音带的读者也能充分利用这项内容,所以只建理文,并在书后附有录音带的文字材料,使其反过来作为阅读理解内容加以应用。作文部分每套题中含有两个作文题,任选其一。每个作文题都有场景介绍或简要说明,以利读者构思。在本册书每套题的阅读理解部分有三篇短文,其起点都较高,确有一定的深度。然而考虑到读者的实际阅读能力,我们对每篇文章,部分生词随文稍加注释,以期顺利阅读。

该两册书的难度均高于现行四级和六级考题,目的在于使考生读后能做到居高临下,应付自如。特别是第二册,如果读者能将本书反复习学,融会贯通,不仅六级参赛有很大的把握,而且对参加出国考试和研究生考试者也是大有裨益。因此,这套书不仅适用于大学生阅读,也非常适用于考研究生、出国生者的学习与自测。

由于时间仓促, 遗误之处在所难免, 敬请广大读者 批评指正。
