


You have finally decided to go away from home for a new lease of life for a short while.

Episode 1 Wanting to go

Conversation

Ye Hanmeng, an executive of a large company in Dalian, China, talks with her friend, Zhang Yunyan who stayed in Australia for two years as a postgraduate student at Monash University and traveled extensively in the country, about her plan of a holiday trip abroad. But she is at a loss where to go because she's already been to many other places both home and abroad on business trips. And her choice now is a hesitant one.

Hanmeng: Hi! Yunyan. Long time no see. How have you been? It's been over two years since I last saw you.

Yunyan: Yes, that's right. I have been doing fine, mate. How are you doing?

Hanmeng: I am doing fine, too. But what did you call me? And your English sounds a bit different from the way you spoke it. It sounds new to me.

Yunyan: Absolutely correct. I have been away to Australia and stayed there for two years.

Hanmeng: That explains it. What did you do in Australia? You studied there or what?

Yunyan: Yeah. I studied there. Hanmeng: At what university? Yunyan: Monash University.

Hanmeng: Really? I have a friend studying there, too.

Yunyan: I didn't only study there. I also traveled extensively in the

country.

Hanmeng: Then you must know a lot about the country. Tell me something about it, please. You know I have decided to take a holiday abroad and have not yet made the decision where to go.Yunyan: You have been working yourself too hard as an executive in that company. You deserve such a holiday. I'd recommend that you go to one of the most beautiful countries in the world and, that's Australia.

Hanmeng: Why?

Yunyan: Australia is a unique island continent that even surprised its first European settlers. It is also a delight for newcomers to explore. Although the land itself is ancient, as are some of its plants, animals and prehistoric art sites, the population is young and vital. The real attraction of Australia is its striking natural wonders and harshly beautiful scenery, but its modern civilization has its own appeal as seen in the fascinating blend of European and Asian elements.

Hanmeng: What's it like in terms of its geographical features?

Yunyan: Australia is the flattest of all the continents with only 5% of the land more than 600 meters above sea level. It is geologically very old and its landmass has been almost free from volcanic and earthquake activity for millions of years. Mountain ranges have smoothed and volcanoes have eroded. Rivers have cut deeply through long rocky cliffs, carving great gaps and canyons.

Hanmeng: What's the climate like there in general?

Yunyan: It is still the driest continent, though the northern part of Australia is tropical and many pockets of dense rainforest are dotted throughout the south and east of the country. It has few rivers and even those do not carry much water. Vast deserts cover most of the Outback. Hanmeng: How big is the country regarding the size of its

territory?

Yunyan: The entire country is over 7.6 million square kilometers, nearly the same size as the United States and twice the size of India and Pakistan together; yet its population is under 16 million, almost the same as the population in Shanghai.

Hanmeng: That's amazing! Just that few people living on that vast continent?

Yunyan: You are right again. Just that small population in that large country and people really enjoy their spacious environment.

Hanmeng: All right. I will certainly consider your suggestion of visiting Australia.

Yunyan: Please do. And I will come back next week to tell you more about the country and help you make the decision.

Hanmeng: OK. See you then. Goodbye.

Yunyan: Bye.
