The idioms compiled in this book are colloquial expressions which are commonly used in conversations by native American speakers. Language is above all spoken, thus we have put these idioms into authentic dialogs covering a wide range of everyday situations. As idioms play an important part in any language, and represent a difficult challenge to non-native learners, we have published this book in order to help students master the particular characteristics of spoken American English.

The 204 idioms in this book have been divided into 34 dialogs, Each dialog contains 6 idioms along with concise definitions and illustrative sentences both in English and Chinese. We have taken one idiom at random from each dialog and have used it as a title. The Chinese translation of the dialog and the index of idioms listed at the end of the book are intended to serve as a reference and study aid.

This book contains some idioms taken from the TOEFL test. These idioms should also be useful to people planning to visit the U.S. and to anyone wishing to perfect their colloquial and idiomatic American English.
