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前 言

我国的开放改革政策使中外的各种交流活动日益增加。在这种情况下,英语口语具有特别重要的作用。为了适应这方面的需要和促进英语口语教学,本书作者根据执教大学英语专业口语多年的实际经验,按照我国高等院校英语专业基础阶段英语教学大纲的要求,编写了这本“大学英语口语”课本,供大学英语专业学生使用。

口语课是大学英语专业的一门重要的必修基础课,其主要目的是帮助学生训练和提高口头表达技能,掌握各种交际表达能力,能在各种情景与语言环境中进行恰当、地道的交谈。

本教材中所涉及的各种功能均有英美两种表达形式。每课的前两段对话是美语,后两段对话是英语。本书的特点是,强调多种多样的课内外训练,要求学生在课堂时间内消化和掌握课文的内容。书中所教交际功能均按交谈者的身份、性别、年龄、社会关系、职业和场合的不同而变化,分为非正式、坦率、正式、礼貌、试探性等语体,并一一加以标明。练习形式包括速记、情景对话、课堂测验、角色扮演等。这些项目便于组织学生在课堂上的活动,使气氛既紧张而又活跃,学生的投入意识强。本书的另一特点是,它的内容有较大的可塑性,教师可根据具体情况进行调整、增补或删除。课后作业是口头作文。书中为此配有有关词汇、短语及提示性思考题目,供学生参考、使用。此外,每课后都附有常用英语词语,供学生自学。书末附有常用英语词汇表及美国节日等资料。

本教材已在湖南师范大学外语系试用三年,效果很好,得到使用它的师生的好评。这次正式出版前,作者根据留学美国一年的切身体会和具体经历,作了一些修正和补充,使它更为完美。

我认为,本书既适合作大学英语专业的口语教本,也可作出国

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留学、考察人员,大、中学英语教师和中、高级英语自学者的参考用书。因此,我高兴地向广大读者推荐它。
