本书是国际劳工局语言专家罗伯特·马杰尔(Robert Majure)先生为中国旅游管理干部学院饭店管理专业的学员编写的餐饮英语基础教材。它以对话的形式,将餐饮专业英语词汇糅在其中,内容丰富,难易适中;且图文并茂,情景交融,生动形象,好的教材。

为了方便中国读者使用本书,我们对原书作了适当改编。在保持原书内容的基础上,我们按主题将对话编排成课文,增加词汇、注释和练习三项内容,目的是使学生能迅速查出某些词典上难以查到的词汇,帮助他们理解课文和掌握各种句型与结构,并通过练习来促进对句型和词汇的灵活运用,提高其口语表达能力。

This textbook provides the trainee with the basic English structures and vocabulary required for food and beverage service. Included are typical dialogs with guests, role playing and pair work. Cassettes accompany the text for old fashioned language laboratory work, especially important for classes taught by non-native speakers. Special importance is given to the pronunciation of French terminology used in food and beverage service.

The teacher's handbook that accompanies this textbook was prepared for a series of textbooks covering all hotel departments: food and beverage service, food production, housekeeping and front office. The teacher's handbook is entitled *Teaching the Target Language for Hotels and Restaurants*. It describes in detail 132 different activities and techniques for teaching lively and communicative language lessons for all departments and for all levels from basic to advanced.

Lesson One An à la Carte Breakfast

An à la carte breakfast is the same thing as an English or American Breakfast in that there is a choice of egg and meat dishes. ① An à la carte breakfast may also be a national breakfast that offers the guest choices such as a Chinese, Indian or Lebanese breakfast for example. ②

With an à la carte menu prices are listed 3 with each item on the menu as, for example, the following items:

A Continental Breakfast

A Continental Breakfast is a light breakfast (4), such as the example below, without a choice of egg or meat dishes.

Bread: a basket (panier) of fresh breakfast rolls, croissants and toast served with butter and marmalade or honey

Americans eat an "American breakfast." English people eat an "English breakfast." In international restaurants, an English or an American breakfast is more or less the same thing—both include egg dishes and can include meat dishes as well. ①

Europeans traditionally eat a "continental breakfast" which does not include eggs or meat. 2

AN ENGLISH OR AN AMERICAN BREAKFAST

Juices: tomato juice, orange juice, pineapple juice or grapefruit juice.

(Juices can be fresh, bottled or tinned or canned.)

Eggs: two eggs cooked as you wish "fried, fried sunny-side-up, fried easy-over, fried cooked-over-hard, soft boiled, hard boiled, scrambled or an omelette with mushrooms, an omelette with grilled tomatoes, an omelette with bacon, an omelette with ham or an omelette with sausages.

porridge(oat meal)or corn flakes
