第1节 标题显示法

阅读技巧

所谓标题是指作者用来点明文章主题的词句。英文中标题可分为几类:第一类是单词或短语式的标题,这类标题的特点是简单明了,读者一看标题,就能知道文章的重点。第二类是陈述式的标题,这类标题往往将文章的主要内容或作者的观点概括出来,使读者一看就知道文章的中心或作者的观点。第三类是提问式的标题,这类标题是以提问的方式点出文章的主题,通过这些标题,我们还可以看出作者的写作意图和文章的文体。因此,认真阅读标题是阅读和理解一篇文章的第一步。

The first true piece of sports equipment that man invented was the ball.

In ancient(古代的) Egypt, as everywhere, throwing stones was a favourite children's game. But a badly thrown rock could hurt a child. Looking for something less dangerous to throw, the Egyptians made what were probably the first balls.

At first, balls were made of grass or leaves fitted together by vines(藤). Later they were made of pieces of animal skin sewed together with feathers or hay inside there.

Though the Egyptians were frequently at war with other countries, they found times for peaceful games each with its own set of rules. Perhaps they played ball more for instruction than for fun. Ball playing was thought of mainly as a way to teach young men the speed and skill they would need for war.
