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# 全国公共英语等级考试第五级(PETS5)强化训练

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# 概 述

PETS5 的全称为 Public English Test System Level 5,即全国公共英语等级考试第五级,听力为 PETS5 的第一部分,考试时间约为 35 分钟(含誊写或转涂时间),题量为 30 题,原始赋分 30 分,权重分仍为 30 分。考生成绩 60 分以上(含 60 分)为合格,其中听力部分还必须有60%以上(含 60%)的得分率,方视为合格。

PETS5 的听力部分重点考查考生对英语口语的理解能力,也就是说,录音材料的内容尽量趋向口语化,目的在于为考生提供比较真实的语言环境,而不是听人在照本宣读,以考查考生在真实的语言环境下的交际能力。PETS5 的听力材料有对话和讲话两种,包括讲座、采访、新闻报道等等。内容涉及面较广,除衣食住行外,还涉及社会科学和科普知识,如:文化、教育、历史、著名人物介绍,以及心理学等等;同时也可能包括世界各地的风土人情,当今社会公众关心的热点问题,如:能源、交通、污染、吸毒、走私等等。总之,内容可能包罗万象,这就要求考生不但拥有充实的语言知识,同时还要具有丰富的背景知识,这样考时才能从容镇定,得心应手。

PETS5 的听力部分由 A、B、C 三节组成。

A节共10小题,考查考生理解具体和抽象信息的能力。要求考生根据所听到的一段500~600 词的对话或独白的内容,判断10个陈述句的正误,录音材料只播放一遍。B节共10小题,考查考生理解细节、事实、要点、观点、态度等的能力。要求考生根据所听到的三段对话或独白(每段280~320词)的内容,从每题所给的4个选择项中选出最佳选项。每段录音材料只播放一遍。C节共10小题,考查考生理解并记录主要信息的能力。要求考生根据所听到的一段对话或独白(700~800词)的内容,回答问题或补全不完整的句子。录音材料播放两遍。

听力部分的所有问题都不在录音中播放,而是印在试卷上。听力考试进行时,考生应将答案划或写在试卷上;听力部分结束前,考生有5分钟的时间将试卷上的答案转涂或誊写到答题卡1上。

本书的编写目的在于给考生提供应试指导,通过大量的强化训练和模拟考试使考生提高听力,熟悉 PETS5 听力部分各节试题的题型,并掌握解题的技巧。

本书分为四部分:1. 各节训练习题(包括应试指导);2. 模拟试题;3. 录音原文;4. 答案。建议考生在做各节练习题之前先阅读应试指导,并应用到训练实践中去。在做完各节训练习题之后,考生应严格按照正式考试的要求去做模拟试题,检验一下自己的听力水平,找出薄弱环节和努力方向,这样,在正式考试时才能取得理想的成绩。(需要说明一点,为了减少录音带的长度,降低本书的制作成本,从而降低本书的价格,在录制强训训练部分的录音时,我们没有留出供读者阅读题目和检查答案的时间,请读者做练习时,按照考试要求操

作。)

应该指出的是,本书提供的应试指导只是作者个人的见解,仅供考生参考。任何应试技巧都应因人而异。因此,希望考生在使用本书过程中不断总结经验,不断完善适合自己的应试技巧。

众所周知,"听、说、读、写"是外语学习的四项基本技能,缺一不可。而在四项技能中,"听"又名列前位,可见其地位之重要。长期的外语教学实践和以往历年的 EPT 考试结果,以及 1999 年 3 月举行的 PETS5 模拟考试和同年 9 月份举行的第一次 PETS5 正式考试的结果证明,听力是中国人学习外语的薄弱环节。这一现象与我国的外语教学现状有着密切的关系。很多学生具有长达十年左右的外语学习的经历,然而多数人不能熟练地阅读外文原版书籍,尤其是听不懂,说不出,难以与外国人直接交流。这是由于长期以来我国的英语教学及考试的重点一直是语法和阅读,忽略了对听力与口语的训练与考查。然而,参加 PETS5 的考生中大多数准备出国攻读学位或进修,他们需要听课、听讲座、参加学术研讨或导师主持的课堂讨论;他们要和同行一起做实验、搞科研,要在学术和专业领域内以及其他方面与外国人交谈;在日常生活中更需要经常和外国人打交道——可以说,"听"无处不在,无时不有。因此,突破"听力关"至关重要。为此,PETS 的设计原则首先是注重对语言交际能力的考查,尤其是对听、说能力的考查。

"冰冻三尺非一日之寒",听力水平的提高同样靠日积月累,持之以恒。所谓"听力"指的是对所听到的信息的理解能力,这种能力不可能在一夜间获得,而须经过一个从量变到质变的过程。听的"量"积累到一定程度,必然会发生"质"的变化,这个质的变化就是"理解"或"听懂了"。而本书的编写正是为了帮助考生加快这一变化的过程。

# A 节练习

A节即 Part A的题型是正误判断(True or False),这种题型对中国考生来说比较陌生。 在我们常见的听力考试中很少有这类题型。考生在做 Part A 时要注意阅读试卷上的指令, 特别是指令中的第一句话,此话虽短,可它却向考生提供了重要信息。这句指令通常会告诉 考生将要听到的是对话还是独白。若是对话,是在哪两个人中间进行的,双方是什么关系; 若是独白,独白者是谁,他的身份是什么。考生千万不要小看这一句指令,因为它对你预测 和理解将要听到的内容十分重要。这句指令可能是这样的: "You will hear a conversation between a boss, John, and an employee Sandy."这句指令给考生提供了以下信息:1. 将要听到的是 一段对话; 2. 对话是在一个老板和雇员之间进行的; 3. 老板是男的(John), 雇员是女的 (Sandy)。既然对话的双方是老板和雇员,那么考生便可以预测他们将要谈论的内容十有八 九与雇员的工作有关(这段对话的大意是老板不满意雇员的工作,要给她调换工作)。脑子 里有了这些信息,再加上有 60 秒钟的时间阅读 10 道题,那么,你对将要听到的内容就能有 了大概的估计了。这句指令也可能是这样的: "You will hear a talk given by a university lecturer."从这一指令中你可以得知你将听到的是一篇讲话,是一位大学老师在给学生做讲座。 有时这一指令可能不提讲话人是谁,但却向你透露讲座的内容,如:"You will hear a talk about Part-time Work in Britain"。总之,这一句指令对考生理解将要听到的内容起着不可低估的作 用。

考生尚需注意的是 Part A 给考生 60 秒钟阅读这部分的 10 道题(10 个陈述句),平均每题 6 秒钟。这 60 秒钟对考生来说也是至关重要的。听前先阅读题的目的在于了解录音的大概内容,有几个人物,彼此是什么关系,大概发生了什么事或将要发生什么。考生在阅读时还要尽量记住这些题都涉及到哪些方面,如:时间、地点、人物、事件的先后顺序,等等。这样,听起来才能有针对性,答题时准确率才能高。一般来说,用 60 秒钟阅读 10 个句子还是做得到的,建议考生使用浏览的方式阅读,以加快阅读速度。

考生经常会提出这样的问题:"究竟是边听边做题,还是把录音听完后再做呢?"笔者认为还是边听边做为好,因为:1. 考生已经用 60 秒的时间阅读了这 10 个句子,可以说对它们所谈及的内容比较熟悉了。2. 10 个问题的顺序基本上是按录音材料内容的先后顺序排列的,几乎没有跳跃,做起来很方便。3. 正误选择题只有两个选择,非"正"则"误"。所以,考

生只需在这二者之间做判断,和多项选择题比较,正误选择相对容易一些。4. 该部分录音 听完后,考生只有 20 秒时间检查答案,即平均每题只有两秒钟。如果不边听边做,靠最后 20 秒的时间完成 10 道题将是十分困难的,甚至是不可能的。

怎样利用最后 20 秒的时间检查答案呢? 在边听边做时,可能有的问题拿不准或根本不会做,建议考生先在该题旁做个记号,不能因为一道题不会做就卡壳,事实上也没有时间去冥思苦想。考生在做题的同时,耳朵还要听录音里连续不断发出的各种信息,大脑还要对这些信息进行分析、推测、概括和综合,所有这些都应同时进行,否则就会顾此失彼,得不偿失。考生可以用最后 20 秒的时间来完成听时没有回答出来的问题,因为录音材料是一个整体,前后的内容都是有联系的,听完整个录音将非常有助于考生理解以前没有理解的内容。所以,建议考生不要把这 20 秒的时间平均分配在 10 道题上。听完整篇录音材料以后,对所听内容有了比较全面和正确的理解,以前不会答的题此时可能会答了,还可能发现前面有的问题答错了。那么,考生就应该利用这 20 秒来补答未答的题,或纠正前面的错误,以做到万无一失。如果要用这 20 秒钟从头到尾把每道题都看一遍,结果往往不是时间不够用,就是走过场,20 秒钟一晃而过。许多考生的经验证明,平均分配这 20 秒钟是不明智的。因此,认真阅读指令,合理使用听前、听时和听后的时间对圆满地完成 Part A 十分重要。
