

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内 容 提 要

本书旨在帮助读者突破英语辨错、改错难关。它共由三部分组成:一、单句划线改错;二、单句不划线改错;三、段落改错。每一部分都附有答案,难题后有注释,语言简明扼要。

改错是一个极富挑战性的常见练习,因为它能考查出学生对语言掌握的准确度及对一些固定搭配、习惯用法及句型等的熟练度。也正因为如此,它也是一个常见考题。欲提高做此类题的正确率就必须多做多练。本书就是根据这种需要编写的。它既适合广大英语爱好者用以检测和提高自己的英语水平,也是考研生、EPT、*TOEFL考生、以及参加在职研究生学位考试,大学英语六级考试、英语专业八级考试的广大考生应试前的应备练习材料。

英语辨错 难题突破

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在当今各类英语考试中,辨错、改错是一个常见考题。这些考试包括高考、研究生入学考试、在职研究生学位考试、大学英语六级考试、英语专业八级考试、EPT、TOEFL等。在教学过程中,辨错、改错也是一个常见练习题,用以检查学生对语言掌握的准确性,培养学生对语言的运用能力。辨错、改错题也是一个难题。如果说只辨错不改错的题还有猜的可能的话,那么改错题则来不得半点儿猜测。它考查的是学生的真功夫。而且因为此类题往往用来对学生进行包括句型、时态、语态、语气、搭配、成语、短语、词汇等多方面的能力进行考核,所以难度较大。然而做此类题的正确率完全可以提高。因为它虽然涉及面很广,但考查的是基本功。根据多年的教学实践,我们认为学生要提高这方面的应试能力就必须做到:1.加强英语基础知识的学习;2.大量练习、反复实践。而且做完练习后不要只满足于核对答案,一定要问个为什么,找到自己没辨出错误的原因,从而发现自己的不足之处。尤其短文改错难度更大,因为它不仅错误涉及面广,而且有些错误要根据上下文才能判断出来。这就要求学生要通读全文,广开思路。做题多,见识广,思路自然就开阔了。一旦熟悉了其套路(一般段落改错都包括加词、去词、改词,而改词又往往涉及到形容词和副词互改,改反义词、改易混淆的词等),再加上坚实的英语基本功,辨错、改错的能力定会很快提高。

为帮助广大英吾爱好者提高辨错、改错的能力,我们特编写了这本《英语 辨错 难题突破》。本书分三大部分:第一部分为单句划线改错。共 20 个练习,每个练习 20 题。每题中有四个划线部分,分别以 A、B、C、D 标出,其中一处有错。考生根据应试的需要可以只辨认不改正,也可既辨认又改正。每个练习要求在 12~15 分钟之内完成。第二部分为单句不划线改错。下列四个单元:一.加词改错;二.去词改错;三.变词改错;四.综合改错。共 20 个练习,每个练习 20 题。每题中有一个错,而且只有一个错(不含拼写和标点错)。每个练习要在 12~15 分钟之内完成。第三部分为短文改错。共 88 段,分列四个单元,每个单元含短文 22 篇。每篇短文中有10 或 15 个错(不含拼写和标点错)分别出现在标有题号的 10 或 15 行中。要求在 15 分钟内,在全面理解短文内容的基础上把错误之处指出并改正过来。或加一词,或去一词,或改一词,不可多处改动。每一部分后附有答案。难题后的解释简明扼要。

该书既适合大学英语四级、六级考生、英语专业八级考生、考研生、托福、EPT以及其他有辨错、改错题英语考试的考生为提高应试能力使用,也适合广大学生在日常学习中使用。既可供自学,也可作教材。我们在编写过程中既照顾到题型实用、难度适当、由浅入深,又充分考虑到选材的知识性、趣味性和题材的多样性,所以我们相信本书不仅是一本实用辨错、改错题集,而且所收各篇短文中的错误一旦被改正过来,它就成了一本内容丰富的阅读文选。
