根据国家教委1985年新颁发的《大学英语教学大纲》 (以下简称新大纲)的规定,大学本科毕业生应达到英语4级水平,并要求对已修完大学英语4级的学生进行全国统一考试。尽管考试内容涉及多方面,但我们认为词汇方面是最基本的。词汇量以及正确应用词汇的能力直接影响对试题的理解。本练习集就是针对词汇问题,按"新大纲"对"4级"词汇的要求选编的。

多次全省预考和首届国家统考的实践证明,这套练习集 针对性及实用性强,能在较短时间内较快地提高学生的应试 能力。通过这套练习集的训练,重 庆 建 筑 工 程 学 院 1985 级学生的成绩普遍提高,在1987年9月20日参加国家首届统 考中取得了优秀成绩(总分均值显著超过全国重点大学的总 分均值。一些院校的英语教师得知这一消息后,纷纷来 所不致索要这套练习集。为了适应 国 家 教 委 "新大纲"的要 求,满足广大英语教师和学生的迫切需要, 我们特在原练习 集的基础上作了部分增添和删改, 为了更便用者, 还对每 题加了必要的注释, 较难理解的句子还附有参考译文。

本书除按"4级"要求选编习题外,还适量增加了部分历 年研究生、出国人员考试试题,所以本书对中高级英语应试。 者都有一定的参考价值。另外,随着教育改革的深入,今后 中学的教学与现在大学的教学在内容上必将 会 有 重 合。所 以,本书对高中英语教师和学生也会有一定参考价值。

本练习集按动词、名词、易误用与混淆的词、介词、副词、形容词等分类编写,习惯用法、词组搭配都较详尽,并 配有生动的例句,便于读者记忆和掌握。

本书的部分习题选自国内外相应的习题集。在编写本书的过程中, 王骏同志协助做了大量的工作, 沙明瑶副教授认真审阅了全文, 在此一并致谢。

编写本练习集是为贯彻《新大纲》所作的初步尝试,错 误之处在所难免,敬请读者指正。
