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前 言

对于多数高校学生来说,通过大学英语四、六级考试的最大障碍莫过于词汇这一关。根据上海外语教育出版社和高等教育出版社最新修订出版的《大学英语教学大纲词汇表》,1~4级应掌握的词汇约4200个,5~6级应掌握的词汇约1300个,但实际考试中出现频度较高的词汇只占《大纲》所给的词汇一半左右。因此广大考生如果能重点掌握好这部分在四、六级考试中出现频度较高的词汇,那么他们的复习便可达到事半功倍的效果。

这套《大学英语四、六级高频词汇》丛书有以下四个特点:

一、以大纲为蓝本

本套丛书是以最新修订的《大学英语教学大纲词汇表》为基础,书 中所收入的词汇全部源自《大纲》,与考生在校的英语学习紧密结合。

二、以词频为突破口

本套丛书的编写组在电脑中输入了从 1994 年至今,历年四、六级考试中出现的全部词汇,并准确记录、分析了这些词汇出现的频率,按出现频率的高低排列为五个级别,一级为出现频率最高,二级次之,依次类推。考生可根据自己的实际水平和时间安排,有计划、有重点地由"高"到"低"各个攻克。

三、用法典型、地道

例句和用法全部采自权威的英语用法词典。

四、学练相结合

本套丛书按当前四、六级考试题型配有大量的练习,并从已曝光 的四、六级真题中选择了部分习题,供考生在学习过程中随时检测自 已的词汇水平以及掌握程度。书后附有答案以供参考。

编写本套丛书的出发点是为了让广大考生在复习迎考中能有一本背得完、记得住、考试用得上的词汇手册。倘若真能实现上述三个效果,编者已不胜欣慰。


