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内 容 简 介

你想获得托福考试高分吗?本书可帮你攻克词汇难关,使你走上托福考试的成功之路。

本书是目前我国少有的一本关于托福词汇试题的工具书,是托福应试者必备的词汇学习指南。

本书有三大特点:第一,全。内容包括托福词汇练习 3000 题,总词汇量相当于 100 套托福试题,内容丰富。第二,真。本书模拟试题和 1984~1992 年全真试题各占一半。读者如严格按照考试规则在规定时间内完成习题,就等于进行了一种实战性很强的应试练习。第三,新。本书把近年托福考试中的词汇部分尽数包含在内,最新的到 1992 年 5 月,读者可从中体察到托福词汇考试的趋向与规律。

使用本书,读者可避免死记硬背,在做大量词汇习题过程中,通过对比、联想、推断等方式加深记忆,增加词汇量,提高速度,获取高分。

本书可供准备出国学习进修人员、托福应试者,以及中、高等院校外语系师生及自学外语者阅读。

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序

随着改革开放的深入,出国学习、进修的人员越来越多。国外高等院校往往把申请者的托福成绩作为录取与否的依据,因此,托福考试的成败至关重要。而英语词汇既是学习一门外语的基础,又是其中较难掌握的部分。浩如烟海的词汇,常使人望而却步。本书的目的在于与有志者相伴,帮助他们渡此难关。

从托福考试试题的结构来看,听力、语法、阅读三部分各占 $\frac{1}{3}$ 的分数,在第三部分中,词汇和阅读又各占 $\frac{1}{2}$ 的分数;从托福试题的时间分配结构来看,第三部分共计45分钟,词汇仅占9分钟,占第三部分时间的 $\frac{1}{5}$,也就是说词汇部分(仅占 $\frac{1}{5}$ 的时间)所得分数与阅读部分(要占 $\frac{4}{5}$ 的时间)所得分数是相等的。由此可见,要想获得托福高分,掌握大量而充足的词汇是成功的一条捷径。而且词汇量的增加对其他几部分也是一大促进,可获得事半功倍的效果。

本书有以下三个特点:

1. 以往的托福词汇书籍均要求读者采用机械记忆方式,作用仅相当于托福常用词汇字典。而本书专门汇集托福词汇练习题,读者可在做题过程中通过理解、联想、逻辑推断等方式加深记忆,避免死记硬背之苦,并逐渐积累临场考试经验。

2. 中国托福应试者的弱点在听力和词汇方面。目前,提高听力的材料很多,应试者可进行有针对性的强化训练。但托福词汇试题汇集成册的书籍几乎没有。本书正好填补了这一空白。本书的词汇题量相当于100套托福词汇试题。即是说,你只需花几元钱,10多个小时,便可进行100次模拟测试。方

法可谓简便快捷,书也可谓物美价廉了。

3. 本书兼顾了模拟和全真两类试题。读者可先做模拟题,以提高做题技巧,把时间控制在9分钟以内,也就是说1分钟要完成3个题。而后,读者可用本书向你提供的1976~1992年的50套全真词汇试题来测试自己的能力和水平。

简而言之,本书的目的是使读者在做词汇习题的过程中增加词汇量,提高做题速度,获取更高分数。衷心祝你成功。
