

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## 前 言

本书根据《全国硕士研究生英语入学考试大纲》、《MBA 全国联考考试大纲》以及《上海市单独考试硕士研究生英语入学考试大纲》的要求编写而成。

全书分为5个部分:

第一部分为词汇与语法,练习形式为选择题和改错题。其中词汇部分要求考生掌握约5500个词汇,包括一定数量的常用商务词汇和大约600个词组;语法部分要求考生掌握各种常用语法结构,包括时态、语态、非谓语形式、虚拟语气、倒装等。这一部分量多面广、综合性强。

第二部分为阅读理解,练习形式为选择题、简答题与完形填空。这一部分中的许多文章均选自近年的英美报刊杂志,题材多样,内容广泛,语言规范而又生动,能使考生在提高英语阅读理解能力的同时学到不少新颖的表达方式,了解到最新的信息。

第三部分为翻译,分为汉译英与英译汉这两种形式。翻译实际上是两种语言的转换,考生只有掌握了两种语言的相异之处及其共性,才能准确地将句子翻译出来,这就需要进行反复的实践。这一部分为考生提供了大量的实践机会。

第四部分为英语写作。考生可以在这一部分学会如何写各种体裁的文章,其中包括商务英语应用文的写作。英语写作也是一门实践课,考生只有通过大量的实践,才能真正提高自己的英语能力,也惟有如此,才能在考试中达到各种体裁的作文要求。

最后一部分是参考答案,帮助考生进行自我测评。

编写此书旨在给广大考生提供一个提高英语语言能力的途径和机会。考生只有通过踏实、认真、勤奋的学习,打下扎实的基础,才能不断提高自己的英语水平,才能在英语考试中应付自如。一分耕耘,一分收获,这永远是取得成功的根本原则。

编者长期在复旦大学从事研究生入学辅导,教学经验丰富,治学严谨而又不断创新。经编者辅导的复旦大学考生在 2001 年 MBA 联考中荣获全国第一,由此亦可见本书在帮助考生提高应试能力上所产生的实效。
