许国璋先生在谈语言符号的任意性与理据时曾经指出。"文 明社会时期创造的新词新语,就不再是任意的了,而是立意的了, 甚至即使是民间任意创造的词,也有语言文字学家赋予有理可据 的形态了。因此可以说,原始时期的语言符号是任意的,部落社 会时期是约定俗成的,文明社会时期是立意的。如果说语言有任 意性的话, 那也只是限于原始时期,在此以后,就不是任意的了。" 英语也不例外。现代英语中出现的新词新语一般来说都是立意 的,都是有理据的,即便是旧时产生的词语其中不少都有其来源 或出处,甚至有一段典故。然而,在语言发展的过程中许多词语 在形式上和意义上都发生了变化,原义可能逐渐丧失,因而理据 也变得模糊。如今我们在遇到这些词语时,往往会觉得它们喻义 隐晦,难以索解。笔者在多年的教学中常常发现一些学生在阅读 英美报刊或文学作品时被一些寓意深刻的词语难住,即使在翻查 词典之后也往往只知其然而不知其所以然,总觉得这些词语的形 式和语义有点古怪,不可理解。可是教员若能及时稍加一点内 容,三言两语道出这些词语的来历出处以及来龙夫脉,则往往会 收到意想不到的效果:不仅可以引发学生的学习兴趣,有助于对 这些词语的理解,而且还可使学生从中了解英美的文化、历史、民 俗等,从中领略英美人的智慧与幽默,从而获得美的感受。

英语中许多词语带有丰富的含义,从字面上是难以领会的。有些源于文学名著、圣经故事、神话传说和寓言故事,有些源于历史事件、名人轶事、风尚习俗、体育娱乐以及动物习性,还有些源自航海、狩猎、农业、商业等。内容包罗万象,涉及社会生活的方方面面。这些词语往往简练概括而又形象生动,机智幽默而又富于哲理。其含义,其由来或典故即使是大型英语词典也难以尽数收入。本书系《英语词源超谈》(上海外语教育出版社,1998)的姐妹篇,所选收的只限于习语。本书所谓习语指典故成语、短语动词、固定词组和谚语,包括口头用语和少数常用俚语。选收的习

语中有一小部分(约有数十条)是笔者十多年前撰写的,曾发表在《翻译通讯》(即今《中国翻译》)、《英语世界》、《外语学刊》、《外语 与外语教学》、《外国语文教学》、《外语教学》、《英美语文教学》、《英语辅导》等杂志上,这次选收进来笔者作了修改和补充。另有数十条系由黄秀兰所撰写,特此说明。

笔者参考了近70种中外辞书和参考书,力求做到材料翔实可信。有些条目翻查的参考书就多达20多种。对于各种可能的说法,只要有理可据,言之成理,均兼收并蓄,并就其可信度略加评论,以供读者参考。有的英语习语与汉语表达方式颇为相似,本书对其结构、形象、喻义等的异同也作了一些对比。为了便于读者印证,书中引语以及人名地名等后面多半附有原文。圣经引语和莎士比亚剧作引语的汉语译文系分别取自《莎士比亚全集》和《新旧约全书》(和合本)。在追溯习语的来源时本书采取了些辞书常用的方式,先对习语做字面的直译或先点出其本义。一是为了保留英语习语形象和修辞手段的特色,二是因为知其字面义就能较容易理解其喻义,知其本义就能较容易掌握其引申义。

本书选收英语习语近 2 000 条(包括异体)。众所周知,要正确使用习语一般说来是不太容易的,而有的习语在普通辞书中,即使是在大型词典中,往往也仅配有一两个例句,甚至完全没有,让英语学习者用起来实在没有把握。为此,本书选收的所有习语几乎都附有例句及其汉译文,以便读者参照。丰富的例句可帮助读者更正确恰当地使用这些习语。为了体现权威性,半数以上的例句是从新近出版的 20 多部英语原版辞书中精选的。

在编写本书时,笔者尽量注意融实用性、知识性、趣味性于一体,并使其带有一定的学术性,试图使之既成为大专院校学生学习英语的工具书,又成为教学、科研和翻译的参考书。

本书是笔者在教学之余写成的,前后历时7年。尽管笔者在主观上作了很大努力,但由于水平所限,加之时间也仓促,谬误疏漏恐难避免,恳请读者不吝指正。
