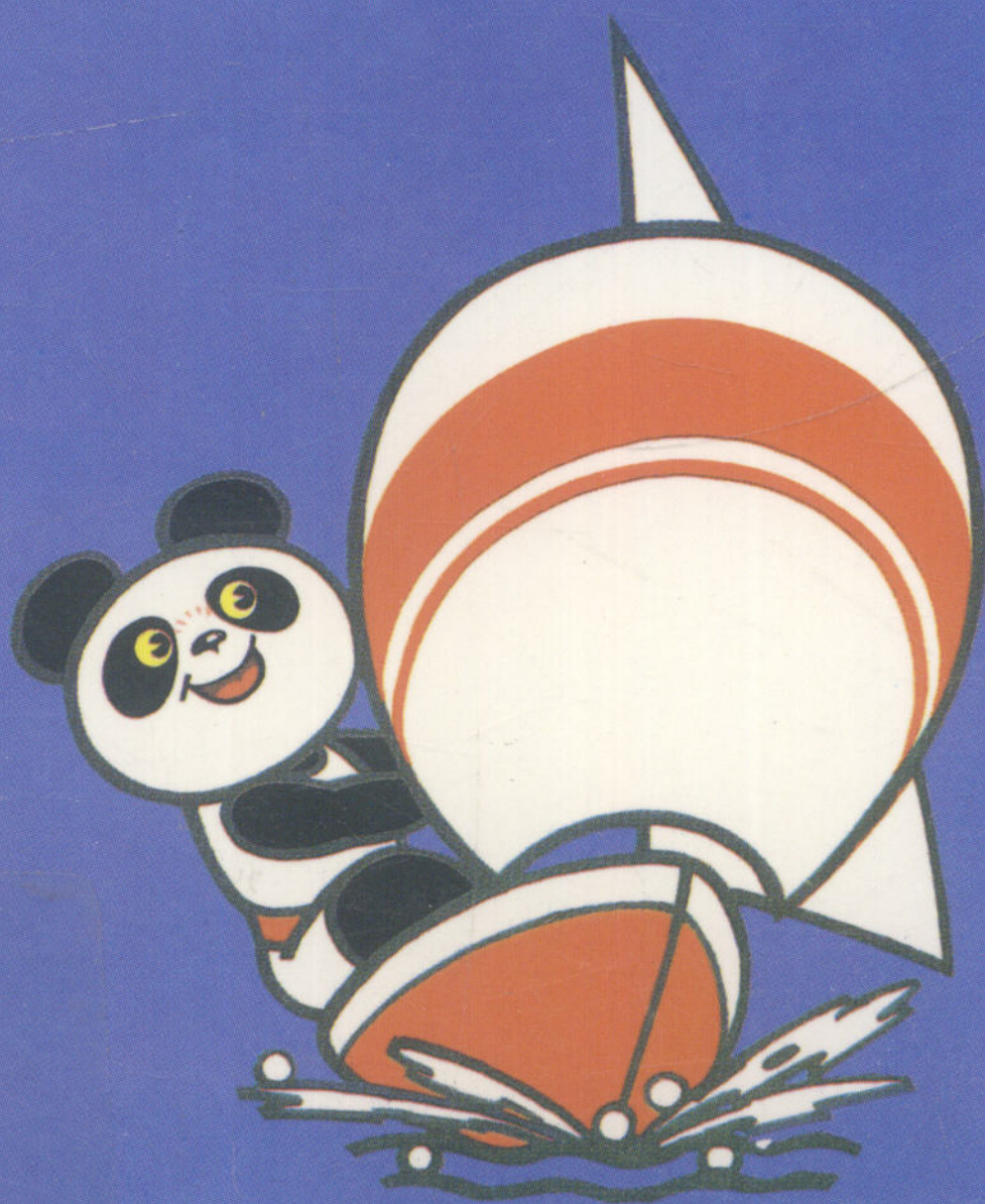

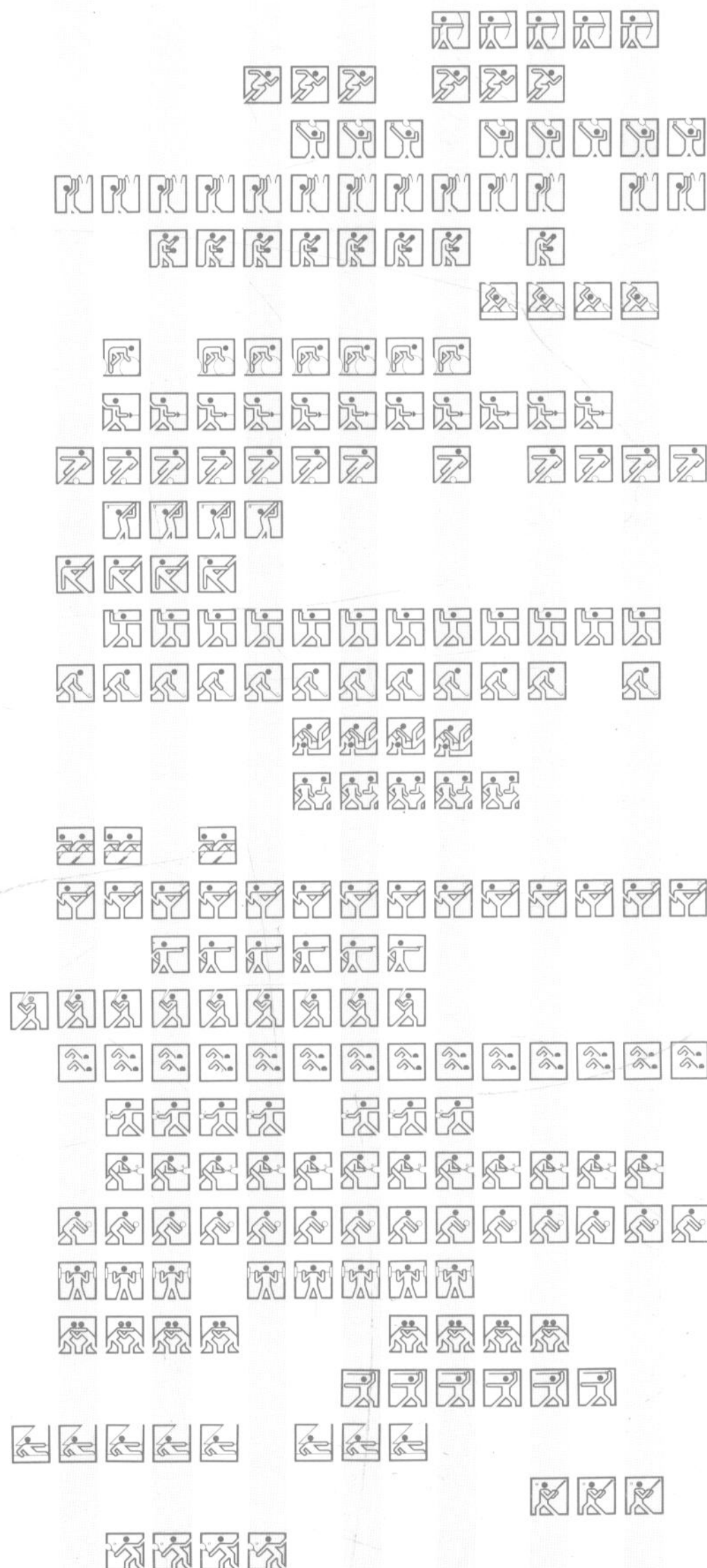

II. Competition Information

1. Dates and Place

The 11th Asian Games yachting competition will be held on the Aquatic Sports Ground on Bohai Bay, Qinhuangdao, Hebei Province, from September 22 through October 1, 1990.

2. Venue

2.1. Competition Site

2.1.1. The racing courses No.1 and No.2 are marked by circles on the Course Chart.

2.1.2. The approximate geographical centres of the racing courses are:

No.1 — 470(M), 470(W), Enterprise and Laser

No.2 — Optimist and Division—II
39 ° 52 '44" N
119 ° 33 '20" E

Other detailed information will be given in the Sailing Instructions.

2.2. Training Site

The harbour and racing course areas will be available for training purposes from September 15, 1990.

4. Race Schedule

The races will be held on two courses:
Course No.1: 470, Enterprise and Laser
Course No.2: Optimist and Division—II
The races will be started in the above order.

The prize—awarding and closing ceremonies will take place on the day of the last race.

This schedule is subject to change depending on the number of participating crews.

5. Participants

5.1. Only athletes who comply with the Constitution and Rules of the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) are entitled to participate in the 11th Asian Games yachting competition.

5.2. Each OCA member may enter one (1) yacht in each class. Each OCA member may enter a maximum of ten (10) competitors and four (4) substitutes for all classes. If only one (1) yacht is entered, only one (1) substitute is permitted. If only two (2) yachts are entered, only two (2) substitutes are permitted. If only three (3) yachts are entered, only three (3) substitutes are permitted. If four (4) or more yachts are entered, only four (4) substitutes are permitted.

5.3. A registered substitute may replace any crew member in any class, but only with the prior written permission of the International Jury.

5.4. In addition to the competitors, each OCA member may register a maximum of five (5) team officials.

6. Entries

6.1. Preliminary Entry (by class and number)

The preliminary entry forms from all teams, forwarded through the respective OCA members, must be received by the Beijing Asian Games

Organizing Committee (BAGOC) not later than 24:00 hours (Beijing Time), June 22, 1990. (The BAGOC's address and telephone and telex numbers can be found on the entry forms.)

6.2. Final Entry (by class and name)

The final entry forms from all teams, forwarded through the respective OCA members, must be received by the BAGOC not later than 24:00 hours (Beijing Time), August 22, 1990. No changes or additional entries will be accepted after this time.

7. Competition Methods

7.1. The 11th Asian Games yachting competition will be conducted in accordance with the 1989–1992 International Yacht Racing Rules, the rules of each class concerned and the Sailing Instructions. In case of disagreement in the interpretation of the Rules and Instructions, the English text published by the International Yacht Racing Union (IYRU) shall prevail.

7.2. Only individual races will be held for the yachting competition. The Olympic Scoring System published in the 1989–1992 IYRU Rules shall apply.

7.3. All yachts to be used in the competition shall be in conformity with the rules of the respective international classes recognized by the IYRU, and must be produced by manufacturers approved by the IYRU.

8. Equipment

8.1. In the Division—II Class, all sailboards and attached equipment including spars and sails will be supplied by the BAGOC.

8.2. Except in the Division II —Class, all OCA members may bring their own yachts including masts, spars and sails.

8.3. Those OCA members who want to have yachts and related equipment supplied by the BAGOC shall indicate this intention in the preliminary entry forms; otherwise these items will not be supplied. Except in the Division — II Class, competitors may use their own compasses and sails, rudders and centerboards which conform to the rules in measurement.

8.4. No replacements or modifications shall be made of, or markings on, the yachts and related equipment supplied by the BAGOC.

8.5. Yachts supplied by the BAGOC will be available from 09:00 hours, September 15, 1990, upon the arrival of the teams.

8.6. No change shall be made in the sail numbers indicated in the entry forms which have been submitted in accordance with Article 6.2., unless with the prior written permission of the International Jury.

8.7. Those OCA members bringing their own yachts should transport them directly to Qinhuangdao in Hebei Province or to Tianjin Port if by sea, or to Beijing Airport if by air. Any intention to have the yachts sent on to the venue

by a transship agent must be clearly indicated in the preliminary entry form and the applicants will bear all the costs involved. No late applications will be accepted.

8.8. All competitors must wear personal buoyancy that meets the requirements of the rules.

9. Medical Control

9.1. Doping Control

Doping control tests will be conducted during the Asian Games yachting competition in accordance with the regulations of the BAGOC and the AYF. The number of competitors to undergo doping tests will be agreed upon by the BAGOC and the AYF.

9.2. Femininity Control

Femininity control tests will be conducted for the 11th Asian Games in accordance with the regulations of the BAGOC and the AYF, except for those competitors who have obtained valid certificates of femininity issued by the IYRU.

10. Competition Management

10.1. The Yachting Commission of the BAGOC, with the participation of officials from the Chinese Yachting Association, will be responsible for the organization of the yachting competition under the guidance of the IYRU and the AYF.

10.2. Technical Organizations

10.2.1. International Jury

The BAGOC will invite one (1) international judge appointed by the IYRU to direct the International Jury.

The International Jury will be composed of one (1) judge from each participating OCA member and the President of the Chinese Yachting Association or his representative.

The International Jury will decide daily on the protests submitted.

The decisions of the International Jury shall be final.

10.2.2. Measurement Panel

The Measurement Panel will be composed of one (1) experienced measurer appointed by the IYRU and two (2) measurers appointed by the Yachting Commission of the BAGOC. The Measurement Panel will be responsible for the measurement of all the yachts and related equipment for the 11th Asian Games yachting competition.

10.3. Sailing Instructions

10.3.1. The Sailing Instructions will be available from August 20, 1990 to the OCA members participating in the yachting competition.

10.3.2. Measurement

1) All yachts competing in the races except Division—II will be measured. Measurement will commence at 10:00 hours, September 16, 1990,

and all yachts must be available from that time.

2) Yachts may be subject to remeasurement at any time during the yachting competition.

10.4. Protests

All protests shall be dealt with in accordance with the International Yacht Racing Rules and the Sailing Instructions.

11. Prizes

Prizes will be awarded to the first six places.

First prize

Silver—gilt medal and diploma for the winner in each class.

Second prize

Silver medal and diploma for the second place in each class.

Third prize

Bronze medal and diploma for the third place in each class.

Fourth to sixth prizes

Diploma for the fourth to sixth places in each class.
