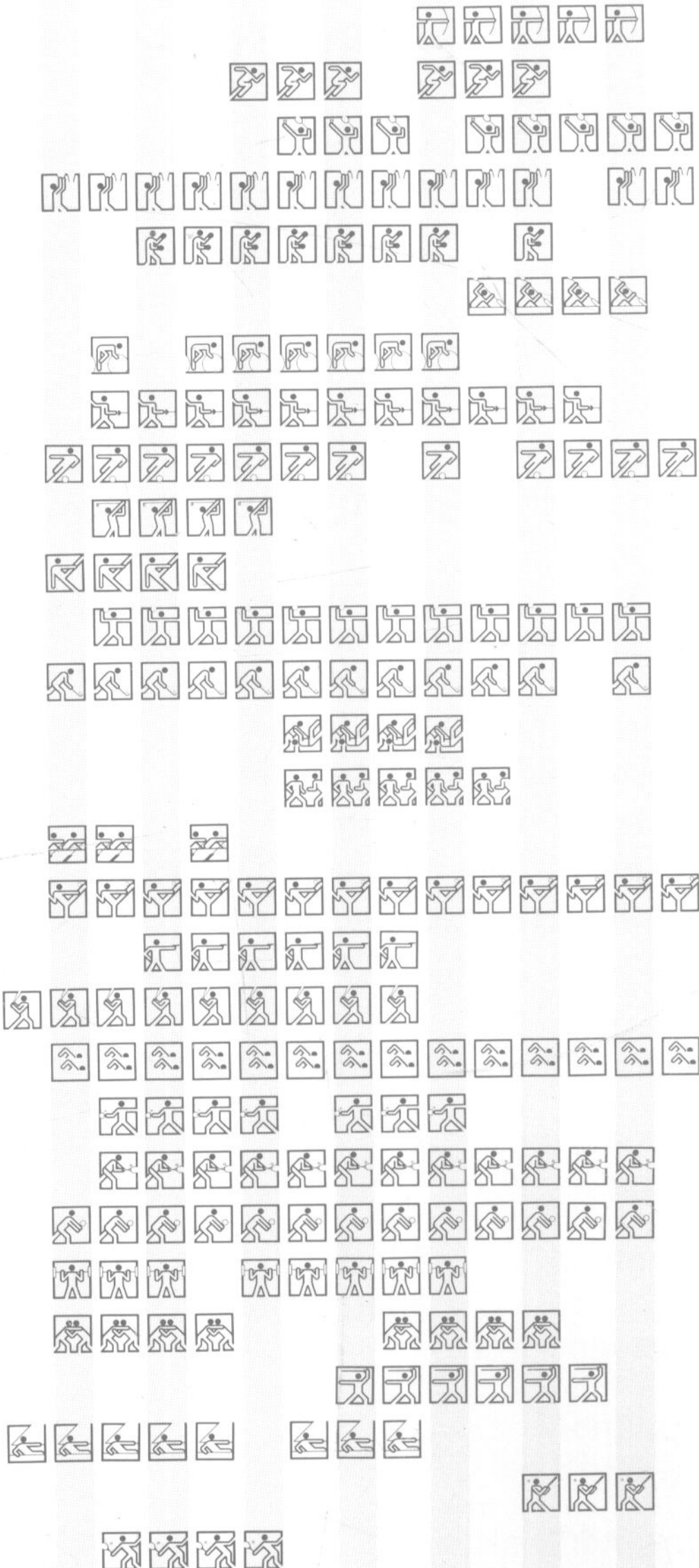

II. Competition Information

1. Dates and Place

The 11th Asian Games Kabaddi competition will be held in Beijing from September 28 through October 2, 1990.

2. Venues

2.1. Competition Site

The Kabaddi competition will take place in the playgrounds of the Beijing Teachers College of Physical Education, which is located in the northwestern suburbs of Beijing, 7 km from the Asian Games Village, with a seating capacity of 5,000.

2.2. Training Site

Practice grounds near the competition site will be available to the competitors.

3. Event

4. Competition Schedule

Each team is to play one match a day.

September 28 (Friday)	Morning	Afternoon
September 29 (Saturday)	Morning	Afternoon
September 30 (Sunday)	Morning	Afternoon
October 1 (Monday)	Morning	Afternoon
October 2 (Tuesday)	Morning	Afternoon

This schedule is subject to change depending on the number of participating teams.

5. Participants

5.1. Eligibility

Only athletes who comply with the Constitution of the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) and the Constitution of the Asian Amateur Kabaddi Federation (AAKF) are entitled to participate in the 11th Asian Games Kabaddi competition.

5.2. Composition

Each OCA member may enter one team composed of 12 players (including substitutes), one manager and one coach for the Kabaddi competition.

6. Entries

6.1. Preliminary Entry (by event and number)

The preliminary entry forms from all teams, forwarded through the respective OCA members, must be received by the 11th Asian Games Organizing Committee (BAGOC) not later than 24:00 hours (Beijing Time), June 22, 1990. (The BAGOC's address and telephone and telex numbers can be found on the entry forms.)

6.2. Final Entry (by event and name)

The final entry forms from all teams, forwarded through the respective OCA members, must be received by the BAGOC not later than 24:00

hours (Beijing Time), August 22, 1990. No changes or additional entries will be accepted after this time.

7. Competition Methods

7.1. The 11th Asian Games Kabaddi competition will be conducted in accordance with the AAKF Rules. In case of disagreement in the interpretation of the Rules, the English text shall prevail. Any unforeseen incidents not covered by the Rules will be resolved in accordance with the Constitution and Rules of the OCA.

7.2. In accordance with the AAKF Rules, if seven or less teams participate, the matches will be played in a single group. If eight or more teams participate, they will be divided into two groups to play league matches. The two top teams from each group will be eligible to play knock-out matches.

7.3. Each OCA member may enter only one team for the Kabaddi competition.

8. Equipment

All equipment in the courts will comply with AAKF Rules. The playing arena will be clearly demarcated. Nobody is allowed inside the playing arena except the players, officials, coaches, team managers and markers (groundsmen).

9. Doping Control

Doping control tests will be conducted during the Asian Games Kabaddi competition in accordance with the regulations of the BAGOC.

and the AAKF. The number of competitors to undergo doping tests will be agreed upon by the BAGOC and the AAKF.

10. Competition Management

10.1. The Kabaddi Commission of the BAGOC will be responsible for the organization of the Kabaddi competition under the guidance of the AAKF.

10.2. Technical Officials

10.2.1. Game Technical Conduct Committee

The Game Technical Conduct Committee, consisting of one Chairman, one convenor and three technical experts from the AAKF, one doctor and one groundsman from the BAGOC, will be responsible for the organization of the Kabaddi competition. The AAKF will, with the approval of the BAGOC, appoint the members of the Game Technical Conduct Committee, with one appointed as the Chairman.

10.2.2. Jury of Appeal

The Jury of Appeal, composed of five to seven persons, including the AAKF President, Secretary General and three experts of the AAKF, will be responsible for dealing with protests.

10.2.3. Officials for Matches

10.2.3.1. The AAKF will select from different member associations 20 qualified officials (four referees, eight umpires, two scorers and six assistant scorers) for conducting the competition.

10.2.3.2. Each participating team is requested to bring one or two officials to be selected by the Game Technical Conduct Committee for the matches. More officials, in case of necessity, will be invited by the BAGOC in accordance with the AAKF Constitution.

10.3. Protests

All protests must be submitted by team managers in writing within 30 minutes after the announcement of results. The Jury of Appeal should make decision within two hours after receiving the protest. The decisions of the Jury of Appeal shall be final.

11. Prizes

Prizes will be awarded to the top six teams.

First prize

Silver—gilt medal and diploma for the winning team.

Second prize

Silver medal and diploma for the second place.

Third prize

Bronze medal and diploma for the third place.

Fourth to sixth prizes

Diploma for the fourth to sixth places.

III. Approval of Technical Handbook

IV. Beijing: A Brief Introduction

Beijing is one of China's ancient capital cities with its rich cultural heritage. It became the capital of the State of Yan during the Zhou Dynasty some three thousand years ago, when it was known as Ji. Later, Beijing was also the capital of the Liao, Jin, Yuan, Ming and Qing Dynasties. Hence it was known as "the royal capital over the millenia."

Now as the capital of the People's Republic of China, Beijing is the nation's political, economic, cultural and sports centre, as well as a hub for international exchanges. With a population of 9,880,000 and covering an area of 16,808 square kilometres, Beijing is one of the world's most densely populated cities.

Beijing is also a famous tourist city with its beautiful sceneries. It boasts the Forbidden City — the world's largest and best preserved palace, the Summer Palace — the largest imperial garden in existence, and the Great Wall — a relic of worldwide renown. Now with its magnificent Tiananmen Square, its network of cloverleafs and its skyline of high-rises, this ancient city has put on a new look, blending classical grace with modernity.

In preparation for the 11th Asian Games, the Organizing Committee has decided, in accordance with the requirements of various international sport federations, to build or renovate 33 stadia and gymnasia for competition and another 46 for training, available to the competitors when they come to Beijing.

To provide the athletes with fine living conditions and help them give of their best in competition, an Asian Games Village is taking shape at Beijing's northern outskirts, in a garden covering an area of five hectares — an ensemble of apartment houses to accommodate 6,000 guests, with services offered by a shopping centre, a recreation centre and other facilities.
