



PREFACE

THIS vocabulary, compiled after many years of quest for Spanish equivalents of English medico-surgical terms, is now given to the Spanish-speaking medical world with confidence, but with full knowledge of its limitations, the compiler being conscious that some of these equivalents may still be missing, even though his search extended through the literature of both hemispheres. He asks all who consult it to apprise him of any lacunæ which they may observe. However, he has taken every precaution to insure absolute accuracy of the interpretation of the fourteen thousand Spanish medical terms translated into good English, for its orthography is that of the Oxford English Dictionary.

He takes this opportunity of thanking those who have so generously helped him, notably Mr. Josep Trueta, M.D. (Barcelona), D.Sc. (Oxon.), the eminent surgeon of Catalonia, who has so nobly devoted the years through which we are passing to the wounded without regard to their race, creed or colour; to Dr. J. Perera y Prats of Madrid, who introduced to his notice the excellent Spanish Medical Dictionary of Joaquin Pi and his French collaborators; to Mrs. Isobel W. Brocklehurst, M.R.C.V.S., of the Veterinary Department of the University of Liverpool for a most useful list of veterinary terms, her unaided contribution to this vocabulary; to Mr. J. T. Shields, librarian at the British Medical Association for free access to his library for much valuable information from Spanish and Ibero-American sources; to Dr. Geoffrey Page, of Cambridge, for many profitable suggestions, and to Mr. J. R. Carey, late assistant to the professor of Spanish at King's College, London, for freely given and most sympathetic help. He would request these and many others who assisted him with critical and constructive correspondence to

accept this expression of heart-felt gratitude. Their names are too numerous to mention, but to each he offers his cordial thanks.

He welcomes the criticism of all who will consult the work and will be happy to express his indebtedness in such future editions as may be demanded.

It is proposed to follow up this vocabulary with a similar volume dealing with the terms employed by English-speaking members of the medical and kindred professions.
