

National Fire Codes

The National Fire Codes are annual compilations of the Codes, Standards, Recommended Practices, Manuals, Guides and Model Laws prepared by Technical Committees organized under NFPA sponsorship in accordance with the published procedures of the Association. Only those documents which have been adopted by the Association are included in the National Fire Codes.

The Board of Directors of the Association appoints persons from those vitally interested, qualified, and active in the areas with which the Committees are concerned so as to achieve a fair balance of affected interests. All service on these NFPA Technical Committees is contributed voluntarily in support of the Association's program for firesafety. While these procedures assure the highest degree of care, neither the National Fire Protection Association, its members, nor those participating in its activities accept any liability resulting from compliance with the provisions given herein, for any restrictions imposed on materials or processes, or for the completeness of the text. Users should realize that complete reliance for firesafety can never rest exclusively on any single safeguard.

The committees responsible for the various texts published herein are given in the introductory sections preceding each. Current committee lists are published in the NFPA Yearbook, which may be obtained from the Association. Official records of the adoption of each standard will be found in the NFPA Technical Committee Reports, the Technical Committee Documentation and Fire Journal, a bimonthly membership publication of the Association.

Volumes 1 through 6 contain documents which have been judged suitable for legal adoption and enforcement (Codes and Standards).

Volumes 7 and 8 contain Recommended Practices, Manuals and Guides which are generally referred to as good engineering practices. Also included in these volumes are such documents as model laws and enabling acts which will be found to be particularly helpful to enforcing agencies.

Many of the documents have been approved by the American National Standards Institute as American National Standards. Most of the documents contained in these volumes are also published by the Association in separate pamphlet form.

Users of this document should consult applicable Federal, State and local laws and regulations. NFPA does not, by the publication of this document, intend to urge action which is not in compliance with applicable laws and this document may not be construed as doing so.

Policy adopted by NFPA Board of Directors on December 3, 1982

The Board of Directors reaffirms that the National Fire Protection Association recognizes that the toxicity of the products of combustion is an important factor in the loss of life from fire. NFPA has dealt with that subject in its technical committee documents for many years.

There is a concern that the growing use of synthetic materials may produce more or additional toxic products of combustion in a fire environment. The Board has, therefore, asked all NFPA technical committees to review the documents for which they are responsible to be sure that the documents respond to this current concern. To assist the committees in meeting this request, the Board has appointed an advisory committee to provide specific guidance to the technical committees on questions relating to assessing the hazards of the products of combustion.

Official NFPA Definitions

Extracted from the Regulations Governing Committee Projects

Section 2. Terms and Definitions.

2-2 Definitions. Where the following terms, commonly found in the Association Committee Documents, are used or defined in the body of the text of a Standard, Code, Recommended Practice, Manual or Guide, they shall be consistent with the intent of these meanings, but these "definitions" may be altered by a Committee to fit the individual needs of the Document. Such altered definition shall be clear and unambiguous in the context in which it is used.

Approved: means "acceptable to the authority having jurisdiction."

NOTE: The National Fire Protection Association does not approve, inspect or certify any installations, procedures, equipment or materials; nor does it approve or evaluate testing laboratories. In determining the acceptability of installations or procedures, equipment or materials, the authority having jurisdiction may base acceptance on compliance with NFPA or other appropriate standards. In the absence of such standards, said authority may require evidence of proper installation, procedure or use. The authority having jurisdiction may also refer to the listings or labeling practices of an organization concerned with product evaluations which is in a position to determine compliance with appropriate standards for the current production of listed items.

Authority Having Jurisdiction: The "authority having jurisdiction" is the organization, office, or individual responsible for "approving" equipment, an installation, or a procedure.

NOTE: The phrase "authority having jurisdiction" is used in NFPA Documents in a broad manner since jurisdictions and "approval" agencies vary as do their responsibilities. Where public safety is primary, the "authority having jurisdiction" may be a federal, state, local, or other regional department or individual such as a fire chief, fire marshal, chief of a fire prevention bureau, labor department, health department, building official, electrical inspector, or others having statutory authority. For insurance purposes, an insurance inspection department rating bureau, or other insurance company representative may be the "authority having jurisdiction." In many circumstances, the property owner or his designated agent assumes the role of the "authority having jurisdiction"; at government installations, the commanding officer or departmental official may be the "authority having jurisdiction."

Code: A Document containing only mandatory provisions using the word "shall" to indicate requirements and in a form generally suitable for adoption into law. Ex-

planatory material may be included only in the form of "fine print" notes, in footnotes, or in an appendix.

Labeled: Equipment or materials to which has been attached a label, symbol, or other identifying mark of an organization acceptable to the authority having jurisdiction and concerned with product evaluation, that maintains periodic inspection of production of labeled equipment or materials and by whose labeling the manufacturer indicates compliance with appropriate standards or performance in a specified manner.

Listed: Equipment or materials included in a list published by an organization acceptable to the authority having jurisdiction and concerned with product evaluation, that maintains periodic inspection of production of listed equipment or materials and whose listing states either that the equipment or material meets appropriate standards or has been tested and found suitable for use in a specified manner.

NOTE: The means for identifying listed equipment may vary for each organization concerned with product evaluation, some of which do not recognize equipment as listed unless it is also labeled. The authority having jurisdiction should utilize the system employed by the listing organization to identify a listed product.

Manual or Guide: A Document which is informative in nature and does not contain requirements.

Recommended Practice: A Document containing only advisory provisions (using the word "should" to indicate recommendations) in the body of the text.

Shall: Indicates a mandatory requirement.

Should: Indicates a recommendation or that which is advised but not required.

Standard: A Document containing only mandatory provisions using the word "shall" to indicate requirements. Explanatory material may be included only in the form of "fine print" notes, in footnotes, or in an appendix.

Notes and footnotes are informatory only and are not mandatory.

1984 Edition of the National Electrical Code

This 1984 edition of the National Electrical Code (NFPA 70-1984) was adopted by the National Fire Protection Association, Inc. on May 19, at its 1983 Annual Meeting, in Kansas City, MO, and was released by the Standards Council on July 14, 1983. It was approved by the American National Standards Institute on August 5, 1983. This 1984 edition supersedes all other previous editions, supplements, and printings dated 1897, 1899, 1901, 1903, 1904, 1905, 1907, 1909, 1911, 1913, 1915, 1918, 1920, 1923, 1925, 1926, 1928, 1930, 1931, 1933, 1935, 1937, 1940, 1942, 1943, 1947, 1949, 1951, 1953, 1954, 1955, 1956, 1957, 1958, 1959, 1962, 1965, 1968, 1971, 1975, 1978, and 1981.

Changes in this 1984 edition of the National Electrical Code (as compared with the 1981 edition) are indicated by vertical lines in the margin.

There is material in Article 517 which is identified as including text extracted from other NFPA documents. This identification is a result of action at the NFPA Annual Meeting and complaints filed with the NFPA Standards Council.

This Code is purely advisory as far as the NFPA and ANSI are concerned but is offered for use in law and for regulatory purposes in the interest of life and property protection. Anyone noticing any errors should notify the Secretary of the National Electrical Code Committee at the NFPA Executive Office.

History and Development of the National Electrical Code

The National Fire Protection Association has acted as sponsor of the *National Electrical Code* since 1911. The original Code document was developed in 1897 as a result of the united efforts of various insurance, electrical, architectural, and allied interests.

In accordance with the provisions of the NFPA Regulations Governing Committee Projects, a National Electrical Code Technical Committee Report containing proposed amendments to the 1981 National Electrical Code was published by the NFPA in June, 1982. This report recorded the actions of the various Code-Making Panels and the Correlating Committee of the National Electrical Code Committee on each proposal that had been made to revise the 1981 Code. The report was circulated to all members of the National Electrical Code Committee, and was made available to other interested NFPA members and to the public for review and comment. Following the close of the public comment period, the Code-Making Panels met, acted on each comment and reported their action to the Correlating Committee. The NFPA published the National Electrical Code Technical Committee Documentation in April, 1983, which recorded the actions of the Code-Making Panels and the Correlating Committee on each public comment to the National Electrical Code Technical Committee Report. The NFPA also published the Advanced Printing of the Proposed 1984 National Electrical Code in April, 1983 to permit the study and evaluation by those interested, prior to formal action on the Committee Report by the 1983 NFPA Annual Meeting. The National Electrical Code Technical Committee Report and National Electrical Code Technical Committee Documentation were presented to the 1983 NFPA Annual Meeting for adoption. The proceedings of that adoption are published in the September 1983 issue of the NFPA Fire Journal ®.

The NFPA has an Electrical Section that provides particular opportunity for NFPA members interested in electrical safety to become better informed and to contribute to the development of the *National Electrical Code* and other NFPA electrical standards. Each of the Code-Making Panels and the Chairman of the Correlating Committee reported their recommendations to meetings of the Electrical Section at the 1983 NFPA Annual Meeting. The Electrical Section thus had opportunity to discuss and review the report of the National Electrical Code Committee prior to the adoption of this edition of the Code by the Association.

The time schedule for processing the 1987 edition of the National Electrical Code is printed in the back of this Code. Anyone may submit proposals to amend the 1984 Code. Forms for this purpose may be obtained from the Secretary of the Standards Council at NFPA Headquarters.

The NFPA Standard Electrical Code for One- and Two-Family Dwellings, NFPA 70A-1984, is an abridged version of the 1984 text, edited only as dictated to eliminate extraneous material not of concern to this type occupancy, and to place in the text only the more popular types of wiring methods, not to exclude any other type authorized by the complete Code.

The National Electrical Code Handbook is published by the National Fire Protection Association. This text was prepared by the NFPA Chief Electrical Engineer and the NFPA Electrical Field Service Specialists.
