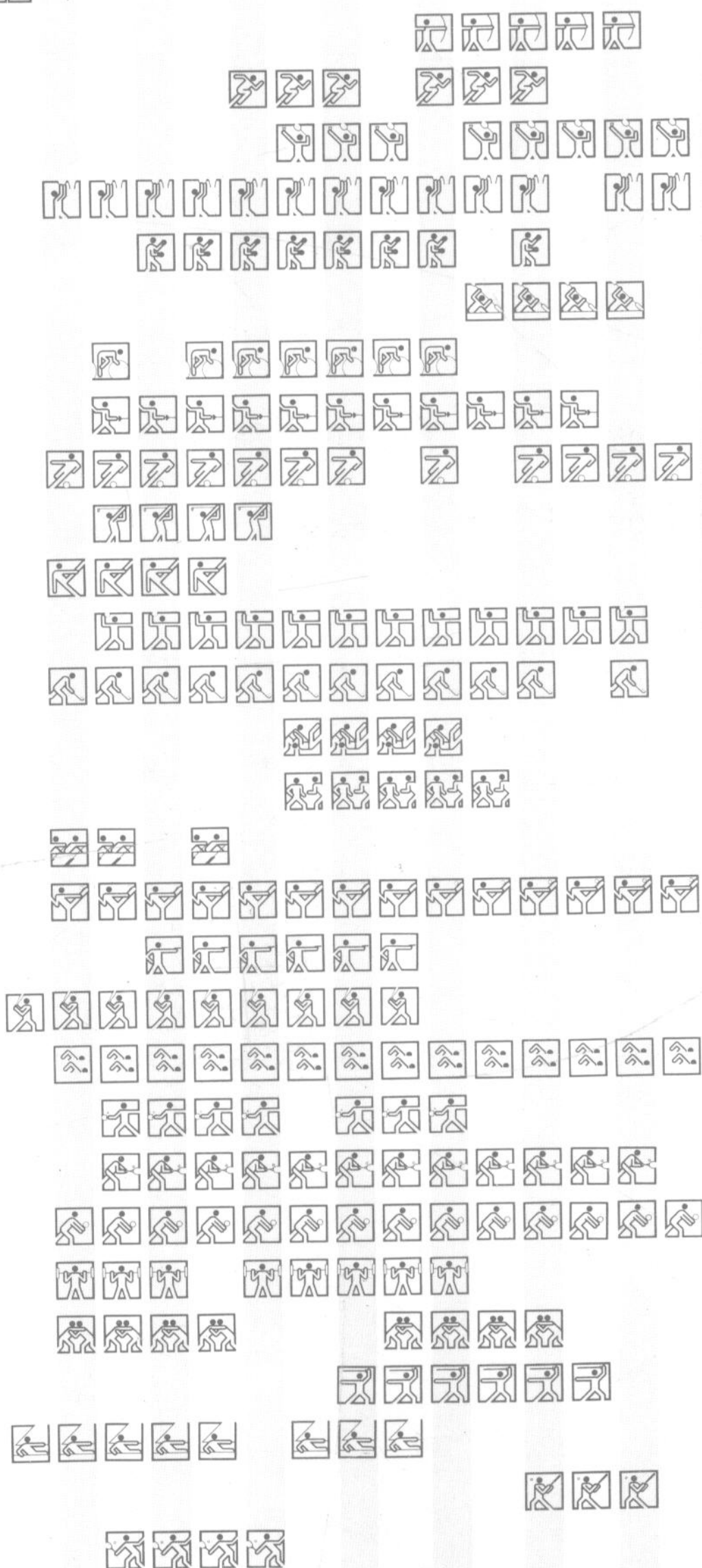

## **II. Competition Information**

### **1. Dates and Place**

The 11th Asian Games canoeing competition will be held in Beijing from October 2 through October 5, 1990.

### **2. Venue**

#### **2.1. Competition Site**

The canoeing competition will take place on the regatta course at the Haizi Reservoir Aquatic Sports Centre in Pinggu County of Beijing, 100m away from the Asian Games Village.

#### **2.2. Training Site**

All training will take place at the Haizi Reservoir Aquatic Sports Centre with lanes and timetable fixed by the 11th Asian Games Organizing Committee (BAGOC).

## 5. Participants

**5.1.** Only athletes who comply with the Constitution and Rules of Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) and Article 2 of the Rules of the International Canoe Federation (ICF) are entitled to participate in the 11th Asian Games canoeing competition.

**5.2.** Each OCA member may enter one boat in each event, with two substitutes in the Men's Kayak, Men's Canoe and Women's Kayak per crew.

## **6. Entries**

### **6.1. Preliminary Entry** (by event and number)

The preliminary entry forms from all teams, forwarded through the respective OCA members, must be received by the BAGOC not later than 24:00 hours (Beijing Time), June 22, 1990. (The BAGOC's address and telephone and telex numbers can be found on the entry forms.)

### **6.2. Final Entry** (by event and name)

The final entry forms from all teams, forwarded through the respective OCA members, must be received by the BAGOC not later than 24:00 hours (Beijing Time), August 22, 1990. No changes or additional entries will be accepted after this time.

## **7. Competition Methods**

**7.1.** The canoeing competition will be conducted in accordance with the current ICF Rules. In case of disagreement in the interpretation of the Rules, the English text shall prevail. Any unforeseen incidents not covered by the Rules shall be resolved in accordance with the Constitution and Rules of the OCA and the Statutes of the ICF. Technical problems will be resolved by the final decision of the technical representatives of the ICF.



**7.2.** Only individual events will be held for the canoeing competition and no team scores will be counted.

**7.3.** All races will be conducted on a six-lane course. If six or less boats participate in one event, only finals will be held. If more than six boats participate in one event, heats, repechages and semi-finals will be held.

### **7.4. Drawing of Lots**

The drawing of lots will be held in accordance with the ICF Rules. The drawing for heats will be held on the morning of October 1, 1990. The subsequent drawings will be held before the first race of each day.

## **8. Equipment**

**8.1.** All equipment and installations will comply with the ICF Rules.

**8.2.** All teams may bring their own boats and paddles.

**8.3.** A limited number of boats and paddles for each event will be available for rental. Those OCA members who want to have boats and paddles supplied by the BAGOC should indicate this intention in the preliminary entry forms. These boats and paddles will be rent in order of entries received. The boats are made in China.

**8.4.** Any intention to have the boats and other equipment sent to China by a transship agent must be clearly indicated in the preliminary entry forms. Details of transport through agencies will

be notified by the BAGOC later.

## **9. Medical Control**

### **9.1. Doping Control**

Doping control tests will be conducted during the Asian Games canoeing competition in accordance with the regulations of the BAGOC and the ICF. The number of competitors to undergo doping tests will be agreed upon by the BAGOC and the ICF.

### **9.2. Femininity Control**

Femininity control tests will be conducted for the 11th Asian Games in accordance with the regulations of the BAGOC and the ICF, except for those competitors who have obtained valid certificates of femininity issued by the ICF

## **10. Competition Management**

**10.1.** The Canoeing Commission of the BAGOC, with the participation of officials from the Chinese Canoeing Association, will be responsible for the organization of the canoeing competition under the guidance of the ICF and the Asian Canoe Confederation (ACC).

### **10.2. Technical Officials**

**10.2.1.** The Judges Committee, composed of international judges from the participating OCA members and the host country, will be appointed by the BAGOC in consultation with the ACC. Other judges needed will be appointed by the Canoeing Commission of the BAGOC.

**10.2.2.** The Jury of Appeal of the 11th Asian Games canoeing competition will consist of representatives of the ICF, the ACC and the Chinese Canoeing Association.

### **10.3. Protests**

All protests shall be dealt with in accordance with the ICF Racing Rules.

**10.4.** Uniforms of identical colours and designs should be worn by the crews of the same team during the competition.

## **11. Prizes**

Prizes will be awarded to the first six places in each event.

### **First prize**

Silver—gilt medal and diploma for the winner in each event.

### **Second prize**

Silver medal and diploma for the second place in each event.

### **Third prize**

Bronze medal and diploma for the third place in each event.

### **Fourth to sixth prizes**

Diploma for the fourth to six places in each event.

### III. Beijing: A Brief Introduction

Beijing is one of China's ancient capital cities with its rich cultural heritage. It became the capital of the State of Yan during the Zhou Dynasty some three thousand years ago, when it was known as Ji. Later, Beijing was also the capital of the Liao, Jin, Yuan, Ming and Qing Dynasties. Hence it was known as "the royal capital over the millenia."

Now as the capital of the People's Republic of China, Beijing is the nation's political, economic, cultural and sports centre, as well as a hub for international exchanges. With a population of 9,880,000 and covering an area of 16,808 square kilometres, Beijing is one of the world's most densely populated cities.

Beijing is also a famous tourist city with its beautiful sceneries. It boasts the Forbidden City — the world's largest and best preserved palace, the Summer Palace — the largest imperial garden in existence, and the Great Wall — a relic of worldwide renown. Now with its magnificent Tiananmen Square, its network of cloverleaves and its skyline of high-rises, this ancient city has put on a new look, blending classical grace with modernity.

In preparation for the 11th Asian Games, the Organizing Committee has decided, in accordance with the requirements of various international sport federations, to build or renovate 33 stadia and gymnasia for competition and another 46 for training, available to the competitors when they come to Beijing.



To provide the athletes with fine living conditions and help them give of their best in competition, an Asian Games Village is taking shape at Beijing's northern outskirts, in a garden covering an area of five hectares — an ensemble of apartment houses to accommodate 6,000 guests, with services offered by a shopping centre, a recreation centre and other facilities.
