

### Publisher's Note



Decorated red pottery tripod, late primitive society over 4,000 years ago. Unearthed in 1971 at Tsouhsien, Shantung.






Bronze ewer with loop handle, Shang Dynasty. Unearthed in 1970 at Ninghsiang, Hunan.







Poshan incense burner inlaid with gold decorations, middle of Western Han Dynasty. Unearthed in 1968 at Mancheng, Hopei.







Two of the 40 bronze coins from Tou Wan's tomb.




Golden brown glazed porcelain flask, Northern Chi Dynasty (A.D. 550-577). Unearthed in 1971 at Anyang, Honan.

Black horse with three-colour decoration, Tang Dynasty. Uncarthed in 1971 at Loyang, Honan.






Silk damask with flower and bird pattern, Tang Dynasty. Unearthed in 1966 at Turtan, Sinkiang.
