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FOREWORD

In presenting the Proceedings of the Conference on High Energy Physics, some words of explanation both about the selection of papers for publication and about the way they finally appear in print are desirable.

The Organizing Committee had already dealt with the very unpleasant task of reducing the very large number of papers submitted for presentation at the Conference to a reasonable number. Nevertheless, for obvious reasons of speed in the appearance of the Proceedings and the cost of printing, the Editorial Board has been forced to make a further selection. The final choice was difficult and although, whenever possible, we sought the advice of the Chairmen, Rapporteurs and Scientific Secretaries of the different sessions, the responsibility for mistakes and any apparently arbitrary decisions is entirely our own. We ask the indulgence of those people whose papers do not appear in the Proceedings and while apologizing to them, we would like to make it quite clear that the exclusion of a paper does not necessarily mean that it was considered unworthy of these Proceedings. In fact, many good papers were eliminated either because they had appeared or were about to appear in other publications or because they departed from the main subjects under discussion during the Conference.

To further reduce the time between the end of the Conference and the appearance of the published Proceedings, numerous shortcuts were used. Uniformity of practice (spelling, symbols, references etc.) and the standardization traditionally maintained in learned publications were not attempted. References were left in the form given by the authors and only roughly checked so that the crudest errors could be avoided. In principle no changes in style or in the lay-out of mathematical formulae were made. However, an attempt was made to remove all ambiguities and to correct any sentence that appeared to be obviously devoid of meaning. Some of the drawings submitted were quite unsuitable for blockmaking. To save time only those of very poor quality were re-drawn by our draughtsmen. So that the Proceedings in their printed form could be logical and more useful the order of the sessions, their numbering and their coverage were changed.

The Conference Organizing Committee as well as the Editorial Board would like to take this opportunity to thank very warmly the Chairmen and Rapporteurs for the very effective and cheerful way in which they carried out their difficult tasks. The Scientific Secretaries and the Conference team of the CERN Scientific Information Service deserve the highest praise for their excellent work—without their untiring efforts these Proceedings would certainly not have appeared so soon after the Conference; and, in that connection, we wish to stress the co-operation and understanding shown by our printers.
