

SMART TRAVEL TIPS A TO Z

Basic Information on Traveling in the United States, Savvy Tips to Make Your Trip a Breeze, and Companies and Organizations to Contact

AIR TRAVEL

BOOKING

Price is just one factor to consider when booking a flight: frequency of service and even a carrier's safety record are often just as important. Major airlines offer the greatest number of departures. Smaller airlines-including regional and no-frills airlines-usually have a limited number of flights daily. On the other hand, so-called low-cost airlines usually are cheaper, and their fares impose fewer restrictions, such as advance-purchase requirements. Safety-wise, low-cost carriers as a group have a good history-about equal to that of major carriers.

When you book look for nonstop flights and remember that "direct" flights stop at least once. Try to avoid connecting flights, which require a change of plane. Two airlines may jointly operate a connecting flight, so ask if your airline operates every segment—you may find that your preferred carrier flies you only part of the way.

Ask your airline if it offers electronic ticketing, which eliminates all paperwork. There's no ticket to pick up or misplace. You go directly to the gate and give the agent your confirmation number—a blessing if you've lost your ticket or made last-minute changes in travel plans. There's no worry about waiting on line at the airport while precious minutes tick by.

CARRIERS

CHECK-IN & BOARDING

Assuming that not everyone with a ticket will show up, airlines routinely overbook planes. When everyone does, airlines ask for volunteers to give up their seats. In return, these volunteers usually get a certificate for a free flight and are rebooked on the next flight out. If there are not enough volunteers, the airline must choose who will be denied boarding. The first to get bumped are passengers who checked in late and those flying on discounted tickets, so get to the gate and check in as early as possible, especially during peak periods.

Although the trend on international flights is to drop reconfirmation requirements, many airlines still ask you to reconfirm each leg of your international itinerary. Failure to do so may result in your reservation being canceled.

Always bring a government-issued photo ID to the airport. You may be asked to show it before you are allowed to check in.

CUTTING COSTS

The least expensive airfares to the United States must usually be purchased in advance and are nonrefundable. It's smart to call a number of airlines, and when you are quoted a good price, book it on the spot—the same fare may not be available the next day. Always check different routings and look into using different airports. Travel agents, especially low-fare specialists (127 Discounts & Deals, below), are helpful.

Consolidators are another good source. They buy tickets for scheduled international flights at reduced rates from the airlines, then sell them at prices that beat the best fare available directly from the airlines, usually without restrictions. Sometimes you can even get your money back if you need to return the ticket. Carefully read the fine print detailing penalties for changes and cancellations, and confirm your consolidator reservation with the airline.

When you **fly as a courier**, you trade your checked-luggage space for a ticket deeply subsidized by a courier service. There are restrictions on when you can book and how long you can stay.

On flights within the United States, most airlines offer non-U.S. residents discounted Visit USA fares, with savings of 25%–30%, provided the arrangements are made outside the United States. Look for air-pass programs that give you a fixed number of domestic flights for a flat fee; discount passes are available from many airlines, including America West, American, Delta, Hawaiian, Northwest, TWA, and United but must be booked or purchased before

you come to America. Check details with the airline or a travel agent.

ENJOYING THE FLIGHT

For more legroom, request an emergency-aisle seat. Don't sit in the row in front of the emergency aisle or in front of a bulkhead, where seats may not recline. If you have dietary concerns, ask for special meals when booking. These can be vegetarian, low-cholesterol, or kosher, for example. On long flights, try to maintain a normal routine, to help fight jet lag. At night, get some sleep. By day, eat light meals, drink water (not alcohol), and move around the cabin to stretch your legs.

FLYING TIMES

Flying time from London is 7 hours to New York; 8 hours, 40 minutes to Chicago; 9 hours, 45 minutes to Miami; and 11 hours to Los Angeles.

Flying time from Sydney is 22–23 hours to New York; and 13 hours, 25 minutes to Los Angeles on a direct flight.

Flying time from Toronto is 1½ hours to New York and 5½ hours to Los Angeles. Flying time from Vancouver is 23 hours to Los Angeles, 4 hours to Chicago.

HOW TO COMPLAIN

If your baggage goes astray or your flight goes awry, complain right away. Most carriers require that you file a claim immediately.

AIRPORTS

The major gateways to the United States include New York, Miami, Chicago, and Los Angeles.

BIKE TRAVEL

Biking the nation's byways, you'll discover farms and factories, forests and strip malls, antique mansions and trailer parks. Stick to roads and bike paths or go mountain biking on the designated trail systems in city, county, and state parks. Check the area's policy on mountain bikes before you hop on the trail, as many parks have banned them to protect the terrain. If you ignore the ban, you could be issued a fine or, worse, have your bicycle impounded. Many ski resorts open their slopes, trails, and chairlifts to mountain bikers during the off-season.

BIKES IN FLIGHT

Most airlines accommodate bikes as luggage, provided they are dismantled and boxed. For bike boxes, often free at bike shops, you'll pay about \$5 from airlines (at least \$100 for bike bags). International travelers can sometimes substitute a bike for a piece of checked luggage at no charge; otherwise, the cost is about \$100. Domestic and Canadian airlines charge \$25-\$50.

RUS TRAVEL

Aside from the two coasts and the major cities, long-distance buses

(motor coaches) serve more of the United States than trains do. Various regional bus companies serve their areas of the country; the most extensive long-haul service is provided by Greyhound Lines. Generally no reservations are needed—buy your tickets before boarding (allow 15 minutes in advance in small towns, up to 45 minutes in larger cities). Long-distance buses often have reclining seats, individually controlled reading lights, rest rooms, and air-conditioning and heating.

CUTTING COSTS

Visitors from overseas can sometimes receive substantial savings on Greyhound by purchasing an Ameripass through their travel agent prior to arriving in the United States. Student discount cards are available at local bus stations.

Students age 15 and over can buy a Student Advantage Card for \$22.50, which gives the user a 15% discount on all Greyhound bus tickets. The cards are valid for one academic year (August to August) and also entitle the holder to discounts at participating hotels, restaurants, car rental agencies, and retail stores.

BUSINESS HOURS

Banks are generally open weekdays from 9 AM until 3 PM, post offices weekdays between 8 AM and 5 PM; many branches operate Saturday morning hours. Business hours tend to be weekdays from 9 to 5, a little later on the East Coast and earlier the farther west you go. Many stores may not open until 10 or 11, but they remain open until 6 or 7; most carry on brisk business on Saturday as well. Large suburban shopping malls, the focus of most Americans' shopping activity, are generally open seven days a week, with evening hours every day

except Sunday. Large all-purpose stores like Wal-Mart are often open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, even in small towns. All across the country, so-called convenience stores sell food and sundries until about 11 PM. Along the highways and in major cities you can usually find all-night diners, supermarkets, drugstores, and convenience stores.

EQUIPMENT PRECAUTIONS

Always keep your film and tape out of the sun. Carry an extra supply of batteries, and be prepared to turn on your camera or camcorder to prove to security personnel that the device is real. Always ask for hand inspection of film, which becomes clouded after repeated exposure to airport X-ray machines, and keep videotapes away from metal detectors.

CUTTING COSTS

To get the best deal, **book through a travel agent, who will shop around.**Also **price local car-rental companies,** although the service and maintenance may not be as good as those of a major player. Remember to ask about required deposits, cancellation penal-

ties, and drop-off charges if you're planning to pick up the car in one city and leave it in another. If you're traveling during a holiday period, also make sure that a confirmed reservation guarantees you a car.

Do **look into wholesalers**, companies that do not own fleets but rent in bulk from those that do and often offer better rates than traditional carrental operations.

INSURANCE

When driving a rented car you are generally responsible for any damage to or loss of the vehicle as well as for any property damage or personal injury that you may cause. Before you rent see what coverage your personal auto-insurance policy and credit cards already provide.

For about \$15 to \$20 per day, rental companies sell protection, known as a collision- or loss-damage waiver (CDW or LDW), that eliminates your liability for damage to the car. Some states, including [California/Nevada], have capped the price of the CDW and LDW. You pay for only the first \$100 of damage to the car in New York State, for only the first \$200 in Illinois. No CDW or LDW is available in either state.

In Arizona, Maryland, Massachusetts, and Utah the car-rental company must pay for damage to third parties up to a preset legal limit, beyond which your own liability insurance kicks in. However, make sure you have enough coverage to pay for the car. If you do not have auto insurance or an umbrella policy that covers damage to third parties, purchasing liability insurance and a CDW or LDW is highly recommended.

REQUIREMENTS & RESTRICTIONS

In the United States you must be 21 to rent a car, and rates may be higher if you're under 25. In New York you must be 18 to rent a car. You'll pay
