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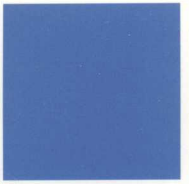

One inevitable change is the aging population using our public spaces today. Limitations of vision, hearing, and mobility will affect us all in time, and public interiors must become more barrier free.

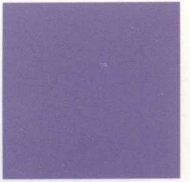
