EDITOR'S PREFACE

The first edition of Compton's Encyclopedia was published in 1922 as an eight-volume home and school reference work. For its day it was unique. It was, for example, the first *pictured* encyclopedia—that is, the first to use photographs and drawings on the same pages with the text they illustrated. Compton's Fact-Index was the first index of any encyclopedia to contain not merely page references to the text but also short, complete articles called Fact Entries. Compton's was also one of the first encyclopedias to maintain a large, permanent editorial staff to ensure continuous growth and revision of the set each year.

On the title page of the first edition of Compton's the following statement appeared:

To inspire ambition, to stimulate the imagination, to provide the inquiring mind with accurate information told in an interesting style, and thus lead into broader fields of knowledge—such is the purpose of this work.

Since 1922 Compton's has never lost sight of its original purpose. It has continued to be an innovative, forward-looking reference work that provides a pleasurable and stimulating reading experience for young people. Compton's editors have consistently maintained the encyclopedia at the highest level of quality. This has been accomplished through the efforts of knowledgeable, experienced, and dedicated editorial, art, and technical-support staffs working with outstanding specialists as contributors and consultants, professional advisory groups for specific areas of interest, and panels of experts in special fields of knowledge.

Each edition of Compton's uses the most recent advances in the graphic arts, from papermaking to color printing. A state-of-the-art computerized publishing system permits editors to update articles rapidly and economically. Each edition of Compton's retains the unique features of earlier editions, and by revision and expansion they are kept up-to-date in fact and in spirit.
