

FOREWORD

A VERY large number of inquiries were received at the Institute in the first year of its existence from foreign students who wished to study in the United States provided they could secure fellowships and from American students who desired to study abroad in the same way, i.e., upon fellowships. Nobody knew, however, how many fellowships of this kind existed. Everybody was aware that many colleges and universities, some foundations, and a considerable number of individuals had established fellowships specifically devoted to assisting foreign students to study here or American students to study abroad. But where they existed, for what subjects of study they were offered and upon what terms they were granted, had never been investigated. The Director of the Institute, therefore, requested Miss Virginia Newcomb, the head of the Bureau of Scholarships and Fellowships, to make as careful a research in the matter as possible. The result is this booklet. It is divided into two parts. The first part is devoted to fellowships offered to American students for study in foreign countries. The second part of the booklet is devoted to fellowships offered to foreign students for study in the United States. The booklet closes with a helpful index which will enable the student to discover at once how many fellowships there are in any particular subject of study and where they are located.

The Director of the Institute understands fully that this is not an exhaustive compilation. As the investigation proceeded practically unknown scholarships were constantly being discovered, whereas others formerly granted were found to have fallen into disuse. This compilation is, however, a beginning and a second edition will be a great improvement provided readers who know of omissions or mistakes will notify the Institute of them. In the meantime it is hoped that the booklet will fill a real need.
