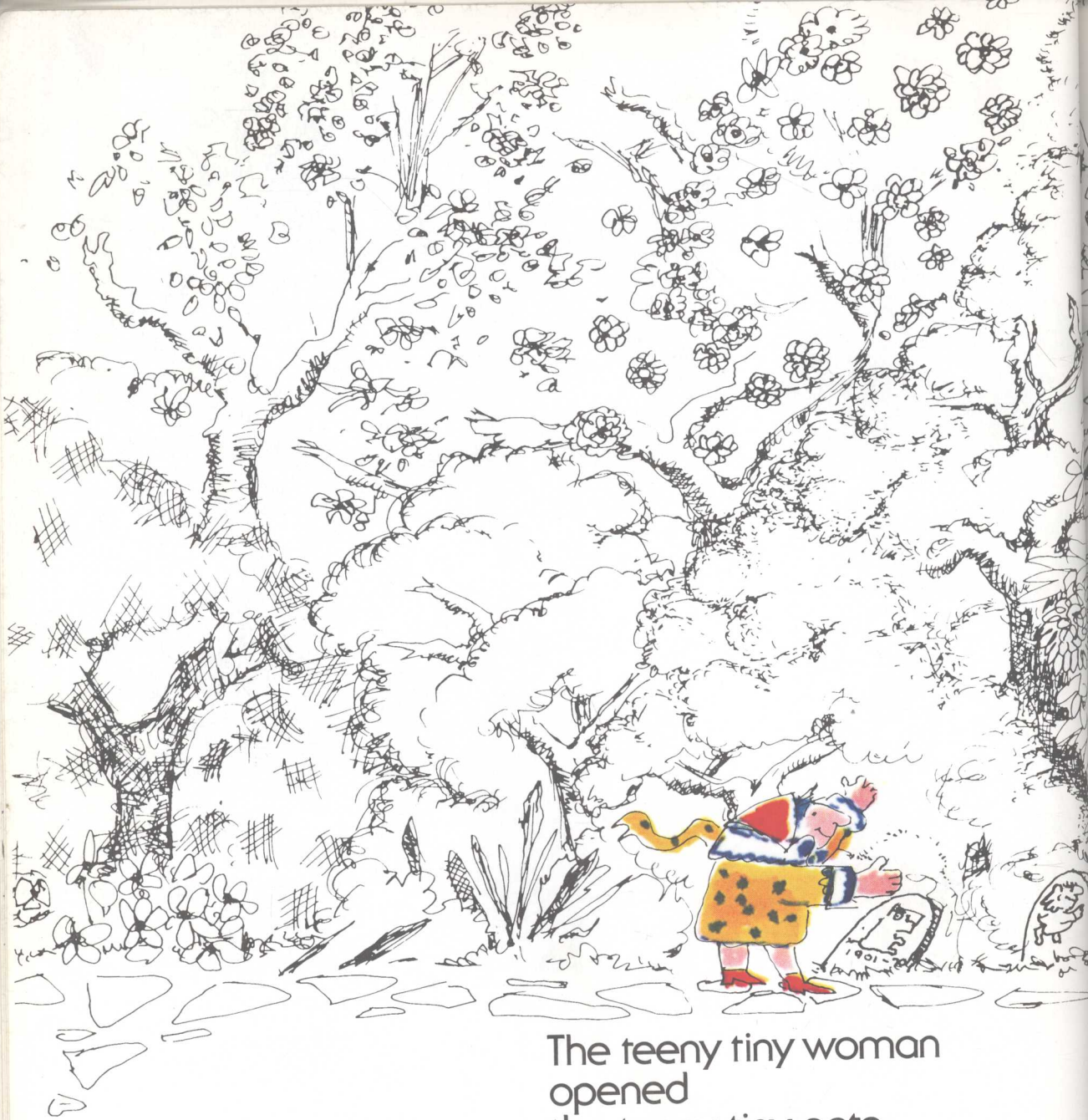


Once upon a time
