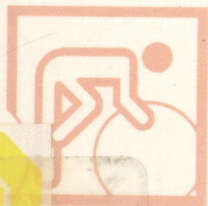

3. Venues and Equipment

3.1. Track Competition Site

The track events will take place at the Changping Velodrome with 6000 seating capacity, located in the northern suburbs of Beijing, about 30km from the Asian Games Village.

Length: 333.33m

Width: 8 metres

Material: Cement

Gradient: 11-37 degrees

3.3. Road Competition Sites

3.3.1. The individual road races for men and women will take place on Road No. 108 linking Changping and Yanqing Counties in the northern suburbs of Beijing. The Starting Line is in front of Ming Yuan Hotel; the Finishing Line is at Xiejishi, Yanqing County. (See map 2)

3.3.2 The route for team time trial is the 25km segment of the road linking the Huairou and Miyun Counties in the eastern suburbs of Beijing. The circuit of 50km is covered twice by each team. The Start and Finish Line will be at the crossing of Miaocheng of Huairou County, the turning points are at the crossing of Xindonglu of Miyun County, and at the crossing of Zhaogezhuan of Huairou County (see map 2)

4. Training Sites

The 11th Asian Games Organizing Committee (BAGOC) will provide training sites and circuits conforming to the Rules of the International Amateur Cycling Federation (FIAC).

4.1. Track

In addition to the Changping Velodrome, the Laoshan Velodrome will be available to all teams for training purposes. It is located in the western suburbs of Beijing, 25km from the Asian Games Village.

4.2. Road

The competition sites for road races, including the 10-kilometre road of the team time trial will be available to all teams for training purposes. In addition, teams may use Laoshan Circuits Road which is 5 kilometres a lap for training. It is located in the western suburbs of Beijing, 25km from the Asian Games Village. Transportation to these sites will be provided by the BAGOC.

For each road event, one official adaptative training race of team events and two for individual events will be arranged on the routes before the competition. Transportation and traffic safety will be provided.

5. Registration Procedure

5. 1. Registration Desks will be set up for both track and road races. One at the entrance of the Velodrome for the track race; the other will be at right side of the starting line for the road race.

5. 2. Registration for individual road events will be done 30 minutes before the race at the starting line. Other events will be done 15 minutes before the race at the registration desk. Those who fail to do so will be disqualified.

5. 3. After groups being divided by the judges according to the regulations of the program, the riders will be shown to the starting line.

5. 4. At the Registration, riders must have their own bikes, helmets, number and wear their uniforms properly. Examinations will be conducted to see whether the bikes, uniforms and the positions of the numbers are in conformity with the regulation.

6. Rest Rooms for Riders and VIPs

6. 1. Track

There are sheds for riders to rest at the south side of the Velodrome. The bike storage room will be around the Velodrome and these rooms will be looked after. The VIP room is at the second floor behind the rostrum.

6. 2. Road

There are some simple rest rooms at both starting and finishing line.

7. Refreshment and Repair Station

7.1. Food and Drinks

Riders are responsible to bring their own food and drinks during the races.

There is one refreshment station (700 metres in scope) for the 180km road race at the north side of the Seven—Arche Bridge of Shisanling Reservoir. According to the regulation, each team is responsible for its own supply.

7.2. Bike Repairing

There will be 4 equipment vans arranged by the Organizing Committee for both men's and women's individual road events. These vans will have bikes and spare parts provided by the Organizing Committee; teams may provide these vans with equipments. In addition, there will be 4 repair stations along the circuit road of Shiisanling Reservoir, at which teams should have their own equipment.

9. Medical Services

9.1. For the road race

100km team time trial:

There will be one ambulance at the starting and finishing lines

There will be two ambulances following the men's and women's road events. And there are three ambulances stationed the crossing of Hu Village, at the west and east entrances off the dam of Shisanling Reservoir and at the gate of the Golf Court respectively. If an accident happened, these ambulances will join the other ones for the first aid.

9.2. Track

The first-aid station will be at centre of the arena; there are two ambulances at the southern tunnel of the Velodrome.

10. Layout of the Management at the Velodrome

11. Confirmation of the list of riders participating in the races

11. 1. Entry should be done no later than 24: 00 hours on August 22nd. 1990

11. 2. Any substitutions after the entry will be dealt with according to the International Regulation concerned.

11. 3. Confirmation must be made at 20: 00 hr one day before the race for the individual events. Each team can hand over the namelist to the liaison station at the Village.

12. Regulation on the press interviews

12. 1. Seats will be reserved for the Press at the Velodrome. All the journalists are required to take their designated seats. Those who have special pass may enter the Velodrome for interviewing and taking pictures. But they are not allowed to enter the track area.

12. 2. Interviews will be arranged after the final matches at the designated place. However, if the rider needs to go through the doping control procedure, the interview should be done later.

12. 3. Press conference will be held for the medalists at the designated area where medalists and their coaches and officials can be interviewed with.

13. Victory Ceremonies

13. 1. Medals will be presented by President of the Olympic Council of Asia or his representatives.

13. 2. The Victory Ceremony will be held 3 minutes later after the finals of each event at the designated area.

13. 3. Should any event have the final for the 3rd and 4th place beforehand, the rider winning the 3rd place must arrive at the Ceremony site to wait for the prize. The prizes for the team events will only be awarded to the 4 riders taking part in the event.

13. 4. The first 3 riders should not leave the site after the road event. They should undergo the doping control after the Ceremony.

13. 5. The riders winning the first 3 places should get to the registration site for the Victory Ceremony. They must wear their sports or official uniforms and shoes for the Ceremony.

13. 6. The languages of Chinese and English will be used in the Victory Ceremony.

13. 7. The Ceremony will proceed as follows:

13. 7. 1. Announcement of the Victory Ceremony

13. 7. 3. Announcement of the names of top three riders

13. 7. 4. March-in of the riders

13. 7. 5. Medal and flowers presentation

13.7.6. Raising of national flags and playing of the anthem

14. Doping Control

In accordance with the regulations of the Beijing Asian Games Organizing Committee and FIAC, doping control will be conducted during the Asian Games Cycling competition.

There are two doping control stations for the Cycling event; one at the west side of the rostrum of the Velodrome; the other one at the starting and finishing line for the 100km team time trial.

The number of riders to undergo the doping test and its procedure will be decided by the Medical Commission of OCA, FIAC, ACF and the Organizing Committee, taking into the consideration of the capability of the laboratory.

After the race or the final results being finally confirmed, the notice for doping test will be delivered to the riders to be tested. Those riders accompanied by one official (team leader, coach or doctor) to report to the doping control station with the accreditation card within one hour after receiving the notice. If rider refuse to undergo the test, the test result will be regarded as positive.

The detailed procedure and requirement should be in

conformity with the Doping Control Technical Handbook issued by the Doping Control Centre.

15. Femininity Control

Femininity control test will be conducted for the 11th Asian Games in accordance with the regulations of the BAGOC and FIAC. All female riders are required to undergo the tests in the Femininity Test Room located in the Village Medical Centre at the schedule date and time designated by the Medical Department. Those riders who have obtained valid certificates of femininity issued by the FIAC can be exempted from the test upon presenting that certificates to the Centre.

16. Appeals and protests

Protests should be dealt with in accordance with the FIAC Rules.

16. 1. Any protest and appeal must be submitted in writing by the team leader and be accompanied by a fee of Swiss Francs (SER) 185,— (or its equivalent).

16. 1. 1. Any protest against the stipulations of riders eligibility, machine entry must be submitted before the race.

16. 1. 2. Individual events.

a. Any protest against the illicit cohabitation or other

irregularity caused during the race must be submitted 15 minutes after finishing the race.

b. Any protest against the classification must be submitted 30 minutes after results are announced.

16.2. All the appeals will be decided by the jury appointed by the FLAC and the Cycling Commission of the 11th Asian Games. Their decision is final.

16.3. The fee will be returned if the protest is upheld and will be retained by the Cycling Commission of the 11th Asian Games if the protest is lost.

17. ACF Congress

The ACF Congress will be held on September 24, 1990.

18. Other Competition Procedures

18.1. Examination of the Membership Cards

18.2. To deliver promptly to each team the results of the race

18.3. To hand over the participation list for the next race to each team after the present event.

18.4. The namelist of cyclists participating in 100km team time trial and team pursuit should be confirmed at 20:00 hr the day before the race. The namelist participating in the race should be handed in to liaison office in the
