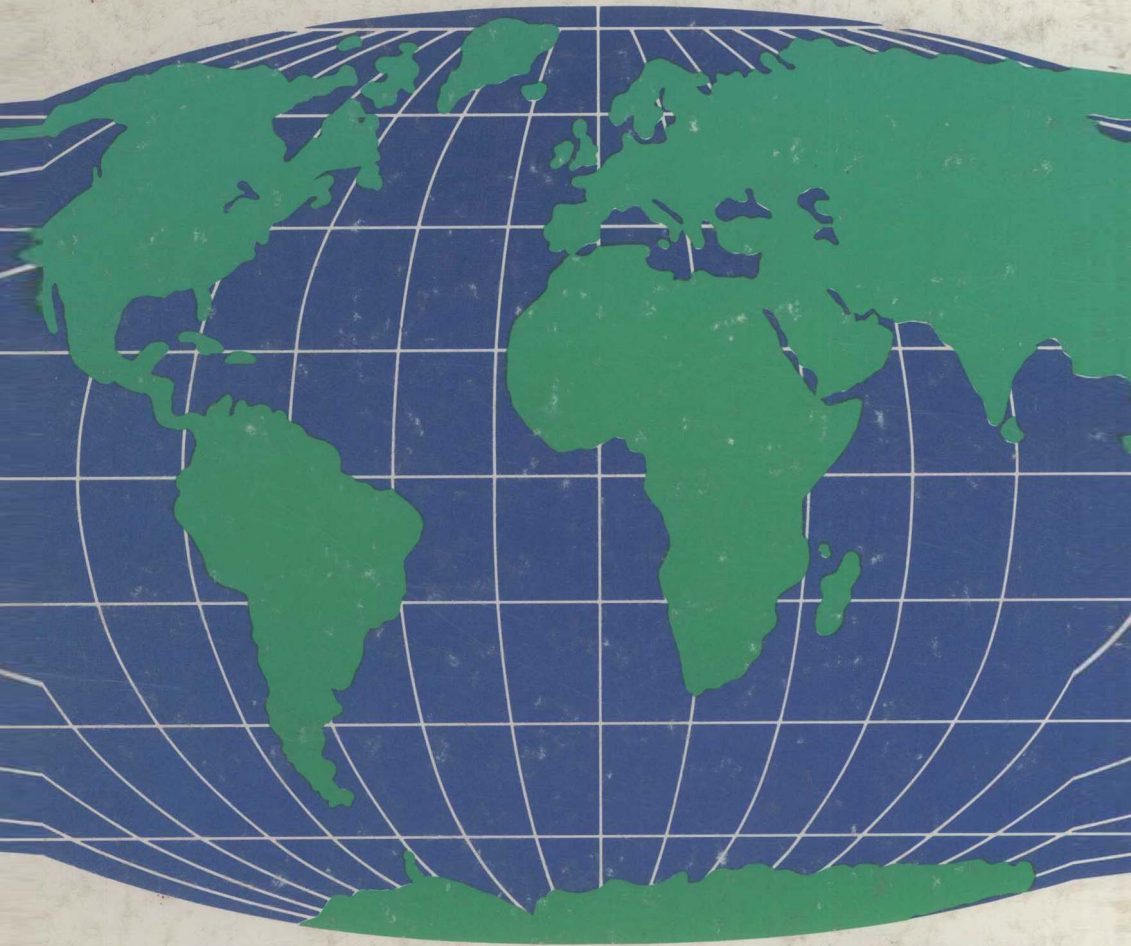

PREFACE TO THE THIRD EDITION

More than a dozen years have passed since *The International Relations Dictionary* emerged to serve as a guide to the rich technical language of international relations. This new edition, like the earlier ones, contains those concepts, theories, facts, and phenomena which the authors believe to be essential to a basic understanding of the international political system.

This book is organized in a format uncommon in dictionaries. Entries are grouped into subject-matter chapters to parallel topics in most current international relations textbooks. In addition to a definition or description, each entry contains a paragraph of *significance* so that the historical roots of a term can be studied. In addition, an extensive cross-reference system is used throughout the book, offering opportunities for the reader to seek additional information. The comprehensive index and the Guide to Countries also facilitate its use as a reference work.

In the world of scholarship, precise language is truly the first scientific tool. The authors believe that the ability to communicate in common in a technical language is fundamental to an understanding of any scholarly field of study. The orientation of this book reflects the classroom experiences of its authors and their belief that emphasis should be placed on learning the basics in every introductory course. The basics in the field of international relations include those concepts, theories, and facts that contribute most to an understanding of how our international political system functions.

The entries included in this book have been systematically selected and organized to complement the subject matter typically found in leading textbooks and in course materials. Thus, the instructor or student can use the *Dictionary* as a teaching/learning supplement to a text or as a tool for unifying courses developed around individual readings. The authors have tried to incorporate relevant data accurately, but we would appreciate it if readers alert us to any sins of omission or commission. However, please note that the authors have

been discriminating rather than exhaustive; we selected only those terms which we consider to be most pertinent to an understanding of the international relations field.

The authors wish to express our appreciation to the many students who over the years have challenged and excited our interest in the field of international relations. We hope that the excitement and interest have been contagious. *The International Relations Dictionary* grew out of our recognition of the need for it, made obvious by these classroom interactions.
