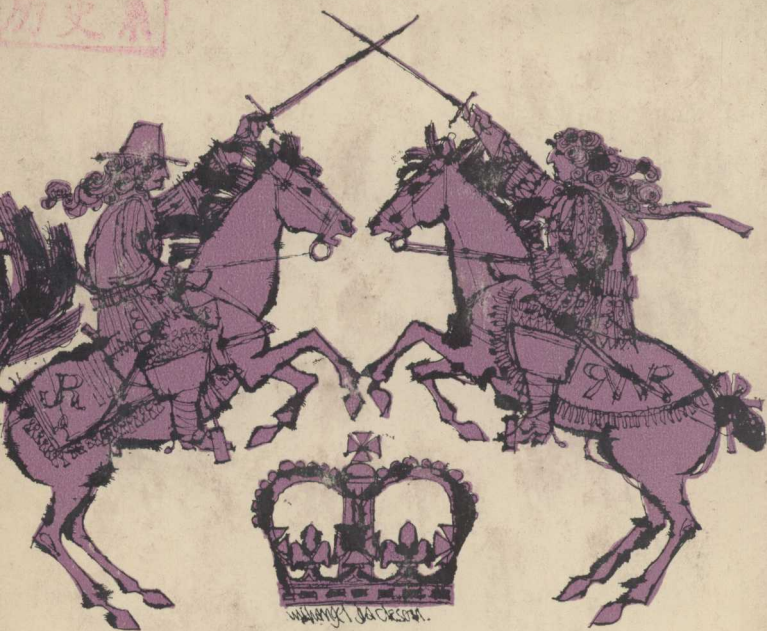


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DOUGLAS JERROLD

THOMAS BABINGTON MACAULAY

Born in 1800. In 1825 he began contributing to the *Edinburgh Review*. He entered Parliament in 1830, and in 1834 became a member of the Supreme Council of India. In 1839 he was Secretary of War and in 1857 was raised to the peerage. Died in 1859, and was buried in Westminster Abbey.

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
