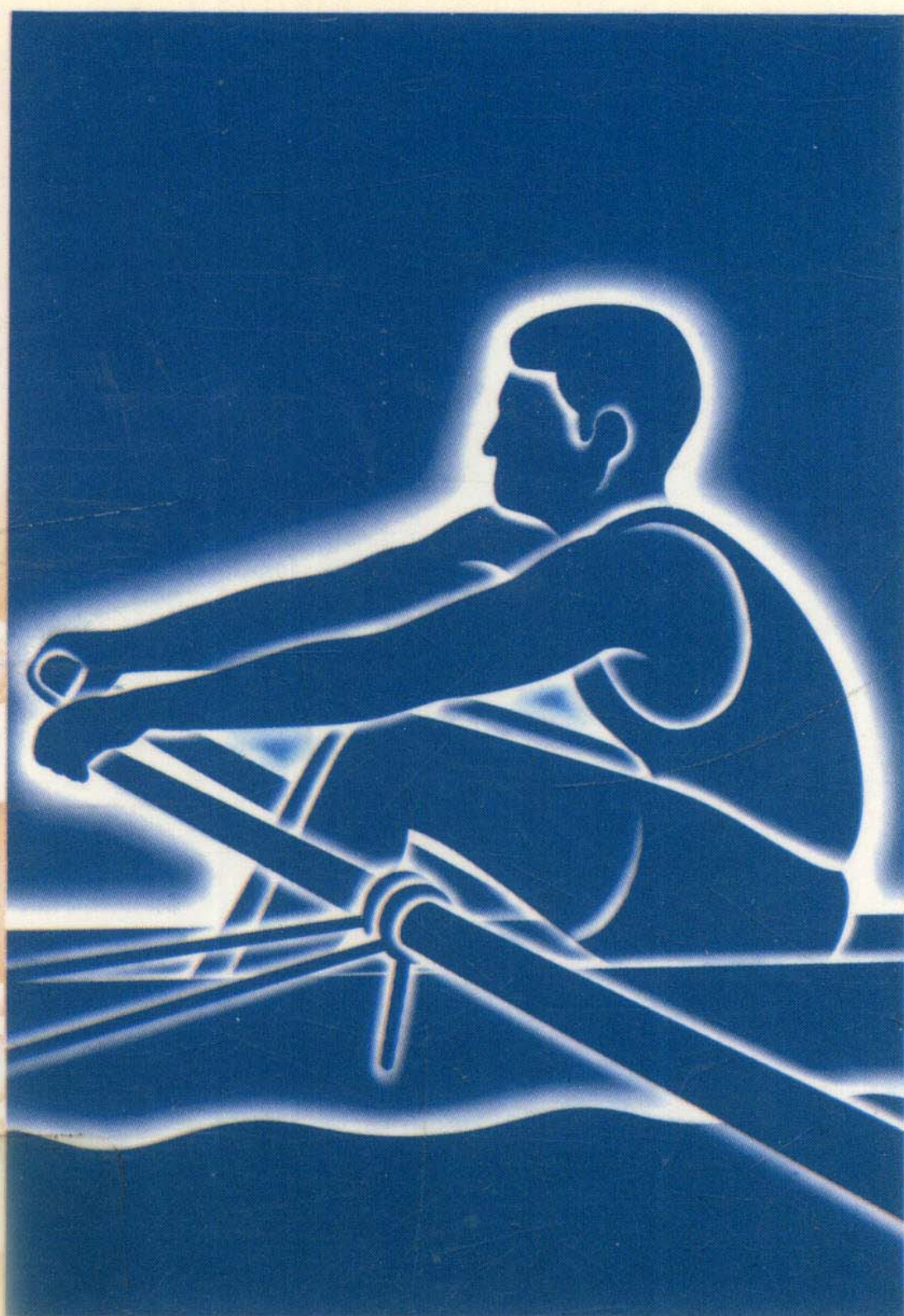

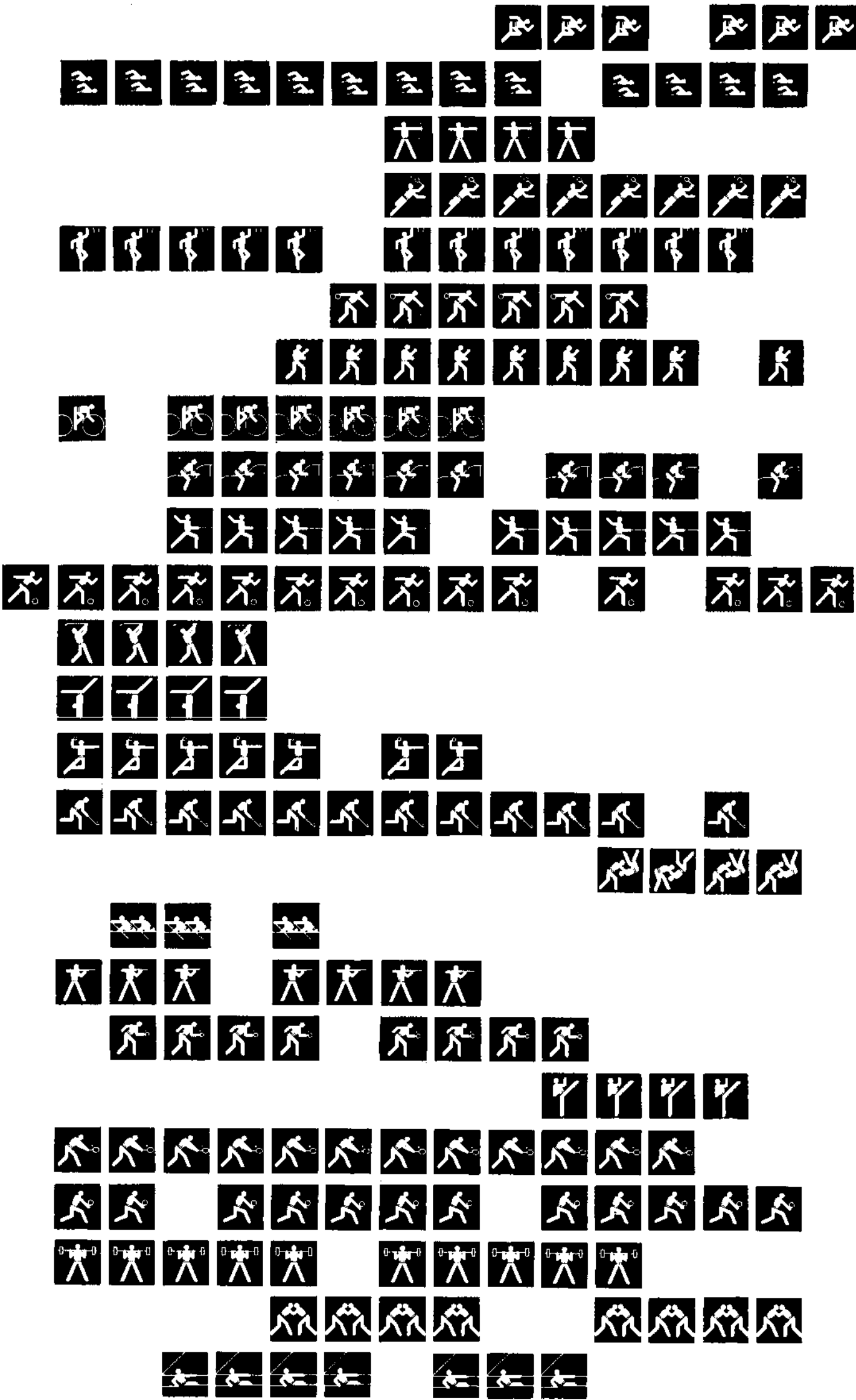

II. Competition Information

1. Dates

The 10th Asian Games rowing competition will be held from September 22 through September 25, 1986.

2. Venues

2.1. Competition Site

The Han River regatta course is located 13km north of the Asian Games Village and 20km east of the Seoul metropolitan area. It will stretch west to east, close to the Paldang Dam and will have 6 racing lanes and two additional ones. Each lane will be 13.5m wide and 2,000m long. Grandstands and open seating areas will accommodate 25,000 spectators, and seats will be reserved for members of the Asian Games Family. Locker rooms, showers, first aid, medical control rooms, resting lounge, boathouses, repair shops and docking facilities will be available in the launching area.

2.2. Training Site

All training will take place at the Han River regatta course according to traffic rules and a training schedule.

3. Events

The rowing competitions will be comprised of the following events:

Women-2,000m

- 1. Pair-oars without coxswain
- 2. Single sculls
- 3. Four-oars with coxswain

Men-2,000m

- 1. Four-oars with coxswain
- 2. Pair-oars without coxswain
- 3. Single sculls
- 4. Pair-oars with coxswain
- 5. Eight-oars with coxswain.

4. Competition Schedule

September 22 Monday	1000	Elimination Heats; Women Men
September 23 Tuesday	1000	Repechage; Women Men
September 24 Wednesday	Rest day	
September 25 Thursday	0900 1000-1240	Petite Finals ; Finals; Women Men

This schedule is subject to change depending on the number of entries for each class of boats.

5. Equipment

All equipment and installations will comply with FISA specifications.

5.1. NOCs are allowed to bring their own boats and oars/sculls in all classes of boats.

5.2. A limited number of boats and oars for all the classes will be available for rental and those NOCs which wish to avail themselves of boats and oars or boats only shall indicate this on the preliminary entries. These will be allotted in the order of entries received.

5.3. The bows of all boats shall be fitted with a white ball 4cm in diameter in soft rubber or similar material unless the bow is so constructed as to afford equivalent protection and visibility.

5.4. Boats, oars and other equipment should be consigned to the official forwarding agent for the 10th Asian Games rowing regatta according to the instructions which will be sent to each NOC on receipt of its preliminary entry.

III. General Rules and Regulations

1. Rules

The 10th Asian Games rowing regatta will be conducted in accordance with the Rules of Racing of the Fédération Internationale des Sociétés d'Aviron (FISA). In case of disagreement in the interpretation of the Rules, the English text will prevail. Any unforeseen incidents not covered by the Rules will be dealt with as follows:

1.1. Cases of a general nature will be resolved according to the Constitution and Rules of the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA).

1.2. Technical questions will be resolved according to the Rules of FISA. Non-technical cases will be settled by the Competition Management Committee.

1.3. Only athletes who comply with the FISA Rules of Racing (Article 10) and the OCA Constitution and Rules are entitled to participate in the 10th Asian Games rowing regatta.

2. Participants

Each National Olympic Committee (NOC) of the OCA member countries may enter one crew in each class of boat. No competitor may compete under two different colours at the same regatta. Substitutes will be allowed as follows:

2.1. Men

Two (2) substitutes for the sweep-oar events or four (4) substitutes if the NOC is entered in the eights with coxswain.

One (1) substitute for the sculling event.

One (1) coxswain.

Maximum total of six (6) substitutes.

No substitute is permitted after the first heat for single sculler.

2.2. Women

Two (2) substitutes for the sweep-oar events.

One (1) substitute for the sculling event.

One (1) coxswain.

Maximum total of four (4) substitutes.

No substitute is permitted after the first heat for single sculler.

2.3. Coxswains shall be deemed to be members of the crew. A women's crew may not therefore be steered by a man, nor may a men's crew be steered by a woman. The minimum weight for a coxswain (in bathing trunks or swimsuit) is 50kg for men and 45kg for women.

To make up this weight, a coxswain may carry a maximum of 5 kg deadweight. No article of racing equipment shall be considered as part of this deadweight.

3. Entries

3.1. Closing Date for Entry Forms by Number (Preliminary)

Entry Forms by Number from all teams, forwarded through the respective NOCs, must be received by the Seoul Asian Games Organizing Committee (SAGOC) not later than 2400 hours (Korea Standard Time), June 28, 1986. Entries may be sent by telex, but must be subsequently confirmed in writing. Telex number: K 21988. The address of the SAGOC can be found on the Entry Form by Number. These entries must state the exact number of competitors taking part in each event.
