## II. Competition Information

### 1. Dates and Place

The 11th Asian Games boxing competition will be held in Beijing from September 25 through October 3, 1990.

### 2. Venue

#### 2.1. Competition Site

The boxing competition will take place in the Boxing Hall of Beijing Institute for Physical Education, which is located in the northwestern suburbs of Beijing, 9.5 km from the Asian Games Village, and has a seating capacity of 2,700.

#### 2.2. Training Site

Boxing Training Hall of Beijing Institute for Physical Education.

### 3. Events

The boxing competition will include the following weight categories:

up to 48kg

5. Participants

5.1. Only athletes who comply with the Constitution and Rules of the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) and the Rules of the International Amateur Boxing Association (AIBA) are entitled to participate in the 11th Asian Games boxing

competition.

**5.2.** Each OCA member may enter 12 competitors, but only one competitor per weight category. No competitors under the age of 17 (born after September 24, 1973) are permitted to participate. Each competitor must have a medical certificate countersigned by the national boxing organization which he belongs to.

## **6. Entries**

### **6.1. Preliminary Entry** (by event and number)

The preliminary entry forms from all teams, forwarded through the respective OCA members, must be received by the 11th Asian Games Organizing Committee (BAGOC) not later than 24:00 hours (Beijing Time), June 22, 1990. (The BAGOC's address and telephone and telex numbers can be found on the entry forms.)

### **6.2. Final Entry** (by event and name)

The final entry forms from all teams, forwarded through the respective OCA members, must be received by the BAGOC not later than 24:00 hours (Beijing Time), August 22, 1990. No changes or additional entries will be accepted after this time.

## **7. Competition Methods**

**7.1.** The boxing competition will be conducted in accordance with the latest Rules of the AIBA. In case of disagreement in the interpretation of the Rules, the English text shall prevail. Any

unforeseen incidents not covered in the Rules will be dealt with in accordance with the OCA Constitution and Rules and the AIBA Articles.

**7.2.** The knock-out system shall be adopted in the competition.

### **7.3. Medical Examination and Weigh-in**

**7.3.1.** The official medical examination and weigh-in for competitors in all categories will be held on September 24, 1990 between 07:00 and 10:00 hours. On the following competition days, only those who are drawn to box shall appear for weigh-in. The competition shall commence three hours after the medical examination and weigh-in.

**7.3.2.** The weigh-in will be effected by delegates authorized by the Federation of Asian Amateur Boxing (FAAB) and the Boxing Commission of the BAGOC. A competitor will be allowed to present himself at the official scale only once each day. The weight registered at the official weigh-in on the first day decides the weight category of the boxer for the whole competition. It is permissible, however, for the boxer of a member organization who has failed to make the weight originally entered at the weigh-in, to enter thereupon for the higher or lower weight category for which he is qualified if such member organization has a vacancy at that weight category and the weigh-in is not yet closed.

### **7.4. Draw**

After the medical examination and weigh-in, the draw will be conducted by the Boxing Commis-

sion of the BAGOC in the presence of the official representatives of all the participating teams, under the direction of the Technical Delegate of the FAAB in september 24, 1990.

## **8. Equipment**

All the equipment and installations will conform to the AIBA Rules and Regulations. All the competitors should bring their own cup protectors and gum-shields.

## **9. Doping Control**

Doping control tests will be conducted during the Asian Games boxing competition in accordance with the regulations of the BAGOC and the AIBA. The number of competitors to undergo doping tests will be agreed upon by the BAGOC and the FAAB.

## **10. Competition Management**

**10.1.** The Boxing Commission of the BAGOC, with the participation of officials from the Chinese Amateur Boxing Association, will be responsible for the organization of the boxing competition under the guidance of the AIBA and the FAAB.

### **10.2. Technical Officials**

**10.2.1.** The Jury will be composed upon consultation between the AIBA, the FAAB and the BAGOC. The Jury will be functioning in accordance with the AIBA Rules.

**10.2.2.** Each participating member organization

may send two and the host country may send three referees or judges to officiate at the competition. All those nominated must be on the AIBA or FAAB list. The referees or judges for each competition will be appointed by the Jury according to the AIBA Rules. The referees or judges shall perform their duties according to the AIBA Rules.

## **11. Prizes**

### **First prize**

Silver—gilt medal and diploma for the winner in each category.

### **Second prize**

Silver medal and diploma for the second placer in each category.

### **Third prize**

Bronze medal and diploma for the two third placers in each category.

### **Fifth prize**

Diploma for the two fifth placers in each category.

## V. Beijing: A Brief Introduction

Beijing is one of China's ancient capital cities with its rich cultural heritage. It became the capital of the State of Yan during the Zhou Dynasty some three thousand years ago, when it was known as Ji. Later, Beijing was also the capital of the Liao, Jin, Yuan, Ming and Qing Dynasties. Hence it was known as "the royal capital over the millenia."

Now as the capital of the People's Republic of China, Beijing is the nation's political, economic, cultural and sports centre, as well as a hub for international exchanges. With a population of 9,880,000 and covering an area of 16,808 square kilometres, Beijing is one of the world's most densely populated cities.

Beijing is also a famous tourist city with its beautiful sceneries. It boasts the Forbidden City — the world's largest and best preserved palace, the Summer Palace — the largest imperial garden in existence, and the Great Wall — a relic of worldwide renown. Now with its magnificent Tiananmen Square, its network of cloverleafs and its skyline of high-rises, this ancient city has put on a new look, blending classical grace with modernity.

In preparation for the 11th Asian Games, the Organizing Committee has decided, in accordance with the requirements of various international sport federations, to build or renovate 33 stadia and gymnasia for competition and another 46 for training, available to the competitors when they come to Beijing.
