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
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Preface

This bibliography was among the works in progress at the time of my husband's death on 21 November 1986. It represents a portion of the work he was engaged in on a New Variorum edition of *Othello*, part of a series sponsored by the Modern Language Association. He was assisted in this work by William R. Introductory Note

The following bibliography for William Shakespeare's Othello was compiled by the late John Hazel Smith over a period of some ten years as indispensable groundwork for his New Variorum edition. Through its publication, we may, once again, benefit from the kind of meticulous and sensitive scholarship that has always been recognized as the hall-mark of Professor Smith's research and earlier published work. This is not just another bibliography from bibliographies. All but a few of the 4097 items it contains were personally tracked down in all the major libraries of this country and England and included only after careful consideration. All items that have not been examined are marked not seen.

The bibliography lists items relating to Othello published through 1984; 1985 is partially covered, and there are a few items from subsequent years. Each section is independent of the others: items which fit several categories are simply repeated in each of the appropriate sections, and all cross-references refer only to other entries within the same section. The place of publication for all books is London unless otherwise indicated.

In about one-fifth of the entries—principally in the "Textual Commentary" section—the bibliography supplies a list of the lines in the play discussed in the entry referred to. Lines are identified by throughline-number (TLN), as established by Charlton Hinman for The Norton Facsimile: The First Folio of Shakespeare (New York, 1968). Hinman's numbering has been extended to include the list of characters which appears at the end of the play in the First Folio; references to that list are used to indicate discussions of character names. The "Index to Commentary on Individual Lines" makes it possible to locate every item which discusses a particular line.

The "General Index" lists all authors, plus the authors of books under review and, alphabetized under short-title, anonymous items. The list of selected editions in the first section is not indexed.
