目前的高考英语总复习大多数时间都是用在以阅读理解为主导的专项训练上,只在考前几个月进行模拟训练,因此,以专题的形式编写英语类高考用书,就显得十分必要。本册即为高考常设题型——完形填空的部分。完形填空属于一种障碍性阅读题,要求考生能很好地把握文章主题,同时必须理解文章的细节,并具有一定的逻辑判断、推理和分析能力,因此,虽然阅读材料的难度本身并不高,但要全部做对却很困难。

从目前全国各省市的情况来看,绝大多数考题采用记叙文,而且各省之间的难度差别也不大。但上海是一个例外,其中的 A 篇难度略高于其他省市,但 B 篇难度却要高出不少;而且,上海卷考题大多采用一篇记叙文、一篇说明文的模式,也就是说,上海卷可以作为其他省市中等以上学生的提高训练。为此,我们将本书分为三章,第一章即除上海外的其他各省市考题总汇,第二章即难度略高的上海卷,第三章为难度更高一点的大学英语四级。实际上,从我们了解的情况看,全国很多重点中学的学生都在自学大学四级英语,而该部分内容对成绩好的学生来说,也是完全没有问题的。

我们一向认为,只有真题才是最好的训练材料,因为它们是教学专家集体智慧的结晶,而其他各种模拟题在试题的科学性上都要打个折扣。可喜的是,自2004年起,全国大多数省份开始独立命题,这极大地丰富了真题的题库容量。本书即编选了自1995年起到2007年13年间的所有真题,我们相信,考生只要能够认真阅读本书,循序渐进,即可达到真正提高英语水平的目的。

由于编者水平有限,错讹之处在所难免,希望读者不吝指正。
