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### 前 言

《新视野大学英语》是配合教育部"新世纪网络课程建设工程"的实施而编写的大学 英语教材。该教材拥有课本、光盘和网络课件三种不同的载体,教学形式新颖、灵活、多 样,体现了时代发展的要求。

《新视野大学英语 词汇与语法练习(活页)》根据上述教材编写,共分四册,每册紧扣《大学英语课程教学要求》对词汇的要求,紧密结合《新视野大学英语(读写教程)》每个单元的阅读课文,进行系统的词汇和语法练习,培养学生综合运用语言的能力。书中练习形式多样,语言地道,难度适当,具有时代性、知识性和趣味性。其中,许多语言例句选自经典名篇,语言规范、实用。

《新视野大学英语 词汇与语法练习(活页)》每册 10 套测试题。每个单元主要由词汇练习和语法练习组成。词汇练习形式多样,包括词义、构词法、搭配、多项选择、短文综合填空和完形填空。语法练习安排在前两册,每套测试题操练一个语法重点,从基本语法到高级语法进行系统训练,第二册最后一套测试题为语法综合训练。在前两册 19 个单元的语法练习中涵盖了四、六级考试中所有语法考点,方便学生备考和教师组织复习。
