



前言 | Preface

无论从哪个角度讲,阅读都是广大中国学生学习英语并提高英语水平的必经途径之一。一则读是听、说、写、译等其他语言技能的基础;二则我们既无语言环境又无法刻意去创造语言环境,然而却可以在阅读中找到语言环境。置身于阅读之中,我们除了可以学到地道的英语之外,还可以接触到讲英语国家的文化,从而领略到讲英语国家的历史、习俗、风土人情。

本书共分两册,每册包括十六个单元,每单元包括四篇课文,每 篇课文后面都编有练习,并附有练习答案和词汇表。这是本书的第一 册,适用于大学非英语专业一年级学生的水平。

本书的最大特点是取材新老兼顾,题材多样,知识性强,语言地道,兼顾趣味性和广泛性。置身其中,你既可以领略光怪陆离的尼斯湖的神秘,又可以追溯风靡一时的"博克"的来源;既可以学习名人的成功之道,又可以了解各国有关数字的迷信……

本书的另一特点是练习的针对性强且全面合理。每课的练习都分为两大部分。第一部分为理解练习(Comprehension Exercises),其中包括根据短文回答问题、英译汉(文中的关键句和难句)、汉译英(练习文中出现的重点词汇或短语)等三种形式。第二部分为词汇练习(Vocabulary Exercises),其中包括易混词、多义词以及构词法练习。

本书由齐世和策划,由齐世和和王欣审定全部稿件,对其中的一



★ A Good Mistake

I made up my mind to South Carolina to meet my friends there. "Can my used car stand such a long drive?" I was not too sure about it. I called my friends in Columbia and they all agreed. "Do drive carefully!" they told me on the phone. So, after I checked my carengine, oil, brakes and everything, I was on my way.

It was exciting to drive on the highway. Traffic on the highway outside Nashville was not as busy as that around the city. (1) All the vehicles were moving so fast that I had to give more gas to keep up with them. To be safe, I just drove on the right-side lane so that I could stop wherever I needed.

Nearly every hour I would stop to check the engine oil, the transmission fluid and the radiator, just to keep my car out of trouble. I kept in mind what someone had once told me, "Take care of your car, and it will take care of you."

I looked at the map from time to time to make sure the direction I took was correct. (2) I had been there once before, but still I asked the way to double check.

At Nshville, there was a juncture. By asking the way, I knew I had two choices: I could go on along the main road or I could take a short cut. The short cut was to cross over several hills. "It's a little dangerous." someone added.

I hesitated for a little while and then chose to be on the safe side—taking the main road. (3) I would rather get there slower than try to be there early and risk falling to the bottom of the hills. It's absolutely true that "Late is better than never."

Something strange happened after I drove a long way and found it was not the correct road that I wanted to take, but the hilly road I decided to avoid. I realized that it was at the crossroad that I had made the direction mistake. "What shall I do?" I asked myself. If I went back to take that road again, it would be very late by the time I got to Columbia. Thinking it over, I decided to go on. "If other people can go along this road, why can't I?" I encouraged myself.

The short cut, to my surprise, was not that dangerous. In fact, it was only a very peaceful country road, going up and down two low hills. There was little traffic. On both sides of the road, you could see trees, wild flowers, and once in a while, farms with cows and horses. My fear was gone with the wind. Listening to the beautiful country music over my car stereo, I drove on and enjoyed the scenery which was so quiet and so natural. No place in the man-made world could compare with it. Even my car forgot to give me problems. It was just in this light-heartedness that I arrived at my destination. My friends, after they heard what had happened to me, all said it sounded like an adventure.

To this day, the experience is still vivid in my mind. I am not Odysseus, but the long car journey to South Carolina, especially the mistake I made on the way, made me understand that, in this world there is always something difficult or dangerous, but after you get fully prepared



and just do it, you will find that it is not so terrible.


