背景说明

外国人和中国人一样, 喜欢邀请朋友到家里吃饭。背了这九句话以后, 你就可以用英文邀请朋友到家里来吃饭了。



1. I'm having a party.

have a party 举办宴会 (= give a party = throw a party)。此外还有a dinner party(晚宴)、a birthday party(生日宴会)、a tea party(茶会)、a welcome party(迎新会)、a farewell party(送别会)等。

I'm having a party. [这句话最常用, 现在进行式可表不久的将来]

= I'll have a party.

= I'm going to have a party.

= I'm planning a party.

I'm having a dinner party.

我要举办一个晚宴。

[纯粹吃晚餐]

I'm having a party.

我要举办一个宴会。

没有特别指定, 对于年轻人也许是舞会, 对于成年人, 也许是吃饭、喝酒等, 因为平常常在一起, 只要说 "I'm having a party." 大致就知道是什么样的party。

在字典上, “举办宴会”的说法有: have a party, throw a party, give a party, hold a party, 只有公司、政府机关才用hold a party。如: The Lion's

Club is holding a party. (狮子会将举办宴会。)

I'm having a party. [最常用]

= I'm throwing a party. [常用]

= I'm giving a party. [常用]

= I'm holding a party. [误, 个人不说hold a party之类的话]

2. It's Friday night.

如果要指明确定时间, 就可以在 "It's Friday night." 后面, 再加上一句话, 说明时间是几点钟。

It's Friday night.

It's six o'clock.

= It's at six.

= It's at six o'clock.

= It starts at six.

It's Friday night at six.

[较常用, 和中国人习惯一样, 日期在前, 时间在后面。]

It's at six o'clock, Friday night.

[较正式, 非一般口语]



比 较

It's Friday night.

[通俗, 美国人常说]

It's on Friday night.

[通俗, 美国人常说]

It's Friday evening.

[较少使用]

It's on Friday evening.

[语法对, 美国人较少使用]

It's this Friday night.

[强调是这星期五晚上]

◀ 3. I want you to come.

want [wɒnt] v. 想要; 希望

want在此作“希望”解。这句话不背, 中国人永远不会说。有些美国人也说“I want you to be there.”或“I want to invite you.”。

面对不太熟悉的朋友才说“I hope you can come.”或“I hope you can be there.”。

◀ 4. You're invited.

invite [in'vaɪt] v. 邀请

这句话中国人不会说, 因为是被动语态,

不合乎中国人的说话习惯，但美国人常说，表示“我邀请你”。

◀ 5. Are you free?

free [fri:] *adj.* 自由的；有空的

邀请别人时，先问别人有没有空，就不会被直接拒绝了。

Are you free? 你有空吗？

= Are you available ([ə'veiləbl] *adj.* 有空的)？

= Do you have time?

也可以说：

Are you busy? 你忙不忙？

= Are you doing anything?

你有没有什么事要做？
