

前言

"五年制高等职业教育英语教材"是根据《五年制高等职业教育实用英语课程基本要求》和《普通高等专科学校英语课程基本要求》编写的。全套教材共8册(16本),其中基础阶段6册,专业阶段2册。每册又分为教科书和练习册。前6册供基础英语教学阶段使用,后2册供专业英语教学阶段使用。

本教材借鉴国内外优秀的教学理论与方法,博采众长,将实用性和知识性融为一体,将应用性贯穿始终,立足实用、打好基础、强化能力。

本教材选文题材广泛,集时代性、知识性、趣味性、思想性、信息性、 前瞻性和实用性为一体,以反映当代的社会生活为主,兼顾科技、政法、文 史等方面的主题,体裁多样,图文并茂。

本教材以素质教育为核心,以培养交际能力为重点,尽量处理好语言知识传授和应用能力培养的关系。此外,还系统地复习和讲授语法和语音知识。

本教材以话题为中心,主要选择实用性较强的常用话题,配合各项基本技能训练项目,多层次、多方面接触语言材料,正确使用语言,充分表达讲话者的想法。

由于编者水平与经验有限以及成书仓促等原因,书中难免有不足之处, 恳请广大师生提出宝贵意见。参加本教材编写的同志还有柳英林、邓学历、 谭小瑛、董平、张伟等。

使用说明

"五年制高等职业教育英语教材"是一套供综合训练的英语教材,适用于五年制高等职业教育和其他相同层次的学校使用。全套教材共8册(16本),其中基础阶段6册,专业阶段2册。每册由教科书和练习册组成。练习册是对教科书的补充,应和教科书配套使用。

本教材每册由 10 个单元组成,每单元都有一个独立的主题,有 Text A 和 Text B 两篇课文。Text A 由 Speaking, Reading, Writing 组成, Text B 为课后阅读材料。每单元后还有语法项目的总结。

编写本教材时, 我们着重从以下几个方面考虑:

- 1. 注意教材的科学性、知识性和可读性的同时,突出语言的信息功能。在选材时,注意结合高职的特点、学生的年龄层次和知识结构等,有针对性地选取介绍外国的社会、文化、教育、风俗等方面的材料。这样,学生可以通过课文学习,既学到语言又不断扩大知识面。
- 2. 注意和初中教材的衔接。在语法教学方面,采取复习旧语法和讲授新语法相结合的形式。同时,尽量简化对语法条文的解释。另外,本书还采用先进的交际教学方法,让学生在做练习的同时,发现并总结语法规律。
- 3. 在词汇教学方面,本教材同样注意与初中教材的衔接。凡是在初中英语教学大纲中出现过的词汇,本教材原则上不再列为生词。
- 4. 教科书和练习册的部分练习的设置注意利用录音设备,以满足英语教学条件差、师资力量不足的学生自学的需要,也有利于英语基础较差的学生学习。
- 5. 针对高职学校的实际情况和学生学习外语的目的,本教材对听、说、读、写、译等技能的要求尽量做到合理,并有所侧重。听、说方面的内容主要是语言的日常交际功能的基本项目;同时,本教材配以适当的笔头练习,包括英、汉对译及写作;对读的要求则略微偏重。

在编写过程中,我们参考了国内外大量的英语教材和有关资料,学习和研究了各种教材的特点,并结合高职学校的实际,经多次讨论和修改,然后定稿。

由于编者水平有限, 疏漏之处敬请国内外同行和读者批评指正。



A musician who played pop music in a club lived in a boarding house in the center of London. He always used to get back to his room very late at night and sometimes in the early hours of the morning. He was so tired when he got back that he would sit on the edge of his bed, take off his shoes and throw them on the floor, and say, "Thank goodness, another day

is over." He would then get into bed and fall fast asleep.

But the poor lodger who had the room under the musician's was woken up each night or early in the morning by the two sounds that the two shoes made as they landed on his ceiling. Finally, he could not stand it any more and went and complained to the musician. Naturally, the musician was very upset and promised that in future after taking off his shoes he would put them down as quietly as possible on the carpet.

The next day, he got back from his club at about one o'clock in the morning, went up to his room, sat on the edge of his bed, took off one shoe and threw it on the floor. He was just about to do the same with the other when he suddenly remembered the promise he had made the day before. So with great care, he put the second shoe down silently on the carpet. Then he got into bed and fell fast asleep.

An hour later, he was woken up by a violent knocking on his door. It was the lodger who slept in the room just under his. "Please! Please! "the lodger pleaded, "drop the other shoe, I've been waiting for a whole hour for you to drop it. As soon as you do, I can go to sleep."

Passage 2

American music flowered in the second quarter of this century. Several conditions lead to the flowering of American music.

These elements first include a lot of creative talent. Where one talent arises we find his work mirrored in the writings of others. These others may themselves be composers of special ability.

Second, there must be opportunity for the technical education of the young composer.

Third, in such periods there seems to be a natural relationship between composer and performer. Music is written to be performed and heard.

Fourth, in such periods there must be an audience for the music of his own time. The public is a willing and interested listener to new music. Such a public expects music to be written and expects to hear it.

There is evidence today that certain of these conditions already exist in America and that others are developing. The first condition is already met. The number of composers writing today in the United States is great.

The second condition, the facilities of the training of the young composers, are present almost everywhere.

The third condition has not fully realized. But there are signs that the listener is not far behind. I am always impressed by the number of young men and women who come back to the greenroom after the performance and discuss the music of Harris.

There are several composers who will influence the direction of composition in the United States for a number of years. Gershwin, for example. His effect on American music has been enormous. His music is gay, witty, emotional, but always fun to listen to.
