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

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前言

听力训练是大学英语教学的重要方面。组织学生在有指导的情况下提高听力能力是将来继续提高语言应用能力必不可少的条件。目前,英语听力教材相对较少,且比较单一。尤其是缺乏课外泛听教材和适用的有声资料。为了使听力教学更好地为贯彻教学大纲服务,使第二课堂更有效地提高学生的听力水平,我们编写了这套《大学英语泛听教程》。

本教程共分 4 册,供大学英语 1~4 级使用。每册分 18 个单元。每个单元为 1 小时,配相应的录音带。全部录音由外籍专家录制。

本教程内容有辨音、听写、填空、单句、短对话、短文、短故事、 长对话和新闻。特别是新闻部分,直接录自美国之音,这在其他同 举听力教材中是罕见的。

本教程编写时注意到知识性、趣味性和实用性,由浅人深,同时兼顾到目前全国大学英语四级考试中有可能出现的听力题型。
