本书依据国家教育部最新修订的《高校英语专业四级考试大纲》的具体要求编写而成。全书由三大部分构成: (1)"单项热身练习"部分根据专业四级考试大纲中各个项目先后排列的顺序,针对考生在这一时段的学习心理特征和具体学习状况,对每个考试项目进行密集式高强度的反复演练,从而强化巩固所学的英语基本技能和基础知识,做好临考前的心理准备。(2)"全真模拟"部分,在对各个考试项目内容熟练掌握的基础上,按"考纲"的要求,进行大量的、难度与真题相当的,并且排列形式相同的综合模拟训练,进而达到及时正确反馈,最后大幅提高考试成绩的目的。(3)"录音材料"部分给出本书听力部分的语音资料,并在网上提供免费 MP3 格式下载,提高读者视听相结合的能力。

本书的读者对象是英语专业二年级学生和报考国家英语六级的非英语专业学生。

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前 言

由国家教育部组织实施的英语专业四级和八级考试每年各定期举行一次,同其他各类 英语考试相比,具有相当高的权威性。其中八级证书的考试代表了我国英语技能教育的最高水平。另一方面,随着我国英语专业教育规模的不断扩大,教学质量的不断提高,测试 规范化水平的不断完善,四、八级英语专业证书的含金量受到社会各界愈来愈多的重视。 学生在校期间能否顺利通过这些考试并获得相应的证书,已成为学校和社会认可的客观标准。因此,努力争取通过四、八级考试,获得证书,就成了所有考生趋之若鹜的追求目标。

为适应当前新形势的要求,国家教育部依据《高等学校英语专业教学大纲》和《高等学校英语专业考试大纲》,在原先制定的"四、八级考试大纲"的基础上,于 2004 年 3 月重新修订并颁布了最新的考试大纲。这对于英语专业四、八级考试,对于检验高等学校英语专业教学大纲的执行情况,无疑具有重大的指导意义。

新的考试大纲对英语专业四、八级考试的要求和内容均作了调整和修改,具体说来, 主要有以下几个方面:

首先,大纲更加重视听、说、读、写、译等基本技能和词汇、句法、语篇等层次的基本知识,适当增加了考题的难度。

其次,专业特征突出,在试题中增加了人文知识一项内容,以反映英语专业本科教育 对英语知识之外的社会文化知识的要求。

第三,为反映综合应用能力,简化了部分考试项目,如将快速阅读部分合并到阅读理解之中,不再单独测试。

第四,为缩短考试时间,减少了试题的篇幅,简化了试题的编排,削减了听力理解部分的长度,减少了阅读量,缩短了听力、阅读和写作的时间。这些变化在八级试题中尤其突出,使该级考试的时间由原来的 215 分钟,减少至现在的 185 分钟。

第五,对试题各部分的顺序作了局部调整。以英语专业四级考试为例,从 2005 年开始, 其考试的形式和内容将有所变化。如考试时间由原来的 140 分钟缩短至 130 分钟(听力理解和阅读理解各缩短 5 分钟);写作由第一部分改为第五部分,且分数比重增加了 5 分,作文的字数要求由原来的 150 个词增至 200 个词左右;而其他项目,如听力理解和完形填空,还有语法与词汇的题数各增加了 5 道,但分值未变;听力理解则由单人陈述、两人对话、新闻广播三部分修改为对话、短文、新闻,每道题由间隔 10 秒钟缩短为 5 秒钟;阅读理解的快速阅读部分被摒弃,阅读文章的长度由 1 500 个单词增加至 1 800 个。英语专业八级考试亦有类似的变化。

总的看来,尽管英语专业四、八级考试在形式上较前有所简化,但在其内容的难度上,则比过去略有加大。其考试效应保证了应有的含金量,足以引起考生的极大关注。

为帮助广大考生通过英语专业四、八级考试,我们依据 2004 年新修订的"大纲"要求,组织具有丰富教学经验的一线教师,严格选材,结合对过去历年四、八级考试的研究分析





结果,并广泛听取了历届考生们的意见和建议,考虑到他们在专业学习中的心理特征及其阶段性学习成果,借鉴了很多用于指导此类考试的辅助读物,本着复习时间集约化的原则,精心编写了这套专门用于帮助考生顺利获得四、八级证书的应试丛书。

该丛书由三大部分组成:单项热身练习、全真模拟和录音材料。所谓单项热身练习,就是按照四、八级真题考试项目排列的先后顺序,对每个项目进行数量较大的,并且具有相当难度的习题集中反复演练的过程。这种大面积、高强度的练习方式,有助于考生对英语的基本技能和基础知识进行巩固强化的积极作用,既符合有意义语言学习的经典理论,又是快速提高考试成绩的"催化剂"。而所谓的全真模拟,即仿真模拟考试训练,则是在全面熟悉考试的各个项目,并且逐步熟练的前提之下,进行适应性全面训练的自我检测过程。这种带有实战性质的持续训练,可使考生处于一种适度的"焦虑"状态之中,随时对所学知识和技能作出及时正确的反馈。其结果自然是考试成绩的大幅提高。此外,在"录音材料"部分给出听力部分的语音资料,并特别提供网上免费 MP3 格式下载,下载网址:httt://www.cmpbook.com/download/16773.rar,以提高读者视听相结合的能力。应该说,本丛书的编排形式,无论是其内涵,还是其外延,都完全符合两个不同时段中考生们的学习心理特征及其认知水平,可谓独具一格。

英语学习是一个不断勤学苦练的过程,坚实的英语基础源于不断的积累。笔者相信,处于两个不同时段的广大考生如果真正具备了相应的英语水平,这套丛书肯定会成为他们的良师益友,帮助他们尽快通过英语专业四、八级考试。在同等水平条件下的学习,虽然学习内容相同,但其编排形式不同,往往会导致不同的学习结果。但愿此书能够给考生带来事半功倍的奇效。

本书由下列老师编写:方笑君、李应洪、陈锵明、肖旭华、庾莉、熊一娣、廖丽琼。 其具体分工如下:方笑君负责完形填空部分;陈锵明负责语法与词汇部分;李应洪负责听 写部分;熊一娣和方笑君负责阅读理解部分;李应洪、肖旭华和廖丽琼负责听力理解部分; 庾莉负责写作部分。方笑君则对全书做了反复的校对和最后的统稿。


