

简介

本书由 1 0 个 Units 组成: 1. 方向 2. 描述 3. 方位 4. 住所 5. 旅行(1) 6. 旅行(2) 7. 公告 8. 交通 9. 工作 10. 新闻。 每个 Unit 含几个 Sections, 每个 Section 由几个 Parts 组成, 其内容都和人们的日常生活、学习和工作息息相关,特别是对那些即将走出国门的人来说,这些内容给他们提供了必不可少的语言和背景知识。 在选材上注重 Authentic English, 目的在于使读者不但能听懂播音员照本宣读式的正式英语,同时也为他们提供大量的真实性英语,使他们对异国他乡的英语不会感到陌生。

本书分学生用书和教师用书两部分。学生用书主要是练习,同时配有词汇表、插图及少量补充练习。 教师用书含录音原文、练习答案及原文译文三部分。

这本书题材广泛,知识性强,实用面广,训练技能全面,练习形式多样,语言自然、生动、活泼,适合中等以上水平的读者,并可做听力课教材。

此书对国外的 TOEFL、IELTS 考试及国内的 PETS (Public English Test System)考试,即全国公共英语等级考试,都极有帮助。 PETS 即原全国外语水平考试 WSK·英语水平考试 EPT。

本书的练习有多项选择 (Multiple Choice)、正误判断 (True or False) 以及简短回答问题等形式,而这些练习形式正是 PETS、IELTS 及 TOEFL 听力考试的试题形式。对于 PETS 考试来说,此书适合于 3-5级的考生。

本书作者是北京语言文化大学(原北京语言学院)出国人员外语培训部英语教研究室的老师,多年从事英语听力教学,经验丰富,熟悉 PETS、TOEFL 及 IELTS 等考试。
