

Unity. Water solves the first, in totality.


Clarity. Air reveals the second, quite transparently.




#### **Internal Attitude**

# What Is My Role?



#### How Do I Perceive?

The Actual: Attention Experience the Object

I sense the actual *Content* of the present, experiencing everything with attention open to the known variables and emerging opportunities.

#### **OPEN PERCEPTION?**

The Novel: Options
Decipher the Object

I conceive the novel *Context* of the present, deciphering everything with awareness open to the unknown variables and evolving options.

#### My Priorities: Continuation My Subjective Impressions

I sense past *Content*, my impressions of what was, closing out all that does not support the continuation of my priorities.

#### **CLOSE PERCEPTION?**

My Plans: Anticipation My Subjective Interpretations

I conceive future *Context*, my interpretations of what will be, closing out all that does not comport with the anticipation of my plans.

Content. To perceive inside the container of the five senses.

Context. To perceive *outside* the container of the five senses.

### How Do I Decide?

My Ideals: Perfection My Subjective Evaluation

I *Harmonize* experientially, refining my ideals by my evaluation of natural human values and their perfect expression.

#### **REFINE DECISIONS?**

My Ideas: Precision
My Subjective Contemplation

I Organize experientially, refining my ideas by my contemplation of natural logical principles and their precise expression.

The Customs: Relations
The Objective Conventions

I *Harmonize* systematically, confined to the customs and conventions prescribed by the general rules of human relations.

#### **CONFINE DECISIONS?**

The Methods: Causation
The Objective Formulas

I *Organize* systematically, confined to the methods and formulas prescribed by the general rules of logical causation.

Harmonize. To decide based on value: more or less.

Organize. To decide based on logic: true or false.



#### Global: Variation

I naturally Globalize: open perception and refine decisions. I perceive objectively (The Actual and The Novel) and decide subjectively (My Ideals and My Ideas). I want freedom of choice. I want the freedom to explore life's abundant variation. I am not shackled to a few themes in life. Strict themes imprison me by limiting my choices. I want to experience all of life as it develops and respond spontaneously to the whole changing present situation. I agree with Charles Dickens: "I ask only to be free. The butterflies are free."






#### Local: Theme








The first four natural numbers mold our perception of the Four Human Natures.
