内容简介

本书的主要目的是通过对通俗易懂的趣味短文的学习,提高学生的词汇量和阅读量,最重要的是提高学生学习词汇的兴趣,改变以往枯燥、陈旧的记忆模式。一方面帮助学生在短期内达到考试大纲所规定的词汇基本要求,以顺利通过考试;另一方面帮助具有相应水平的英语学习者提高英语学习兴趣,扩大英语知识面和词汇量。本书以大学英语六级考试大纲为基础,通过幽默诙谐的短文,使考生在轻松愉快的环境中掌握重点词汇的使用。本书对每个重点词汇分别从讲解、例句、辨析、练习四方面进行了全面的剖析,以便帮助同学们充分地掌握词汇,为六级考试的其他部分打下很好的基础。

前 言

全国大学英语六级考试 (College English Test-6),简称 CET-6,是由国家教育部高教司组织的一项大规模标准化考试。考试的主要对象是,根据教育大纲修完大学英语六级的大学本科生或研究生,以及社会上大学毕业但未获得六级证书的人员。

大学英语四、六级考试是配合现行的"大学英语教学大纲"于 1987 年推出的,每年参加考试的人数近 200 万人,是我国目前规模最大的英语水平测试。由于四、六级英语考试是目前全国最权威的英语考试,且社会上不少用人单位把是否通过四、六级考试作为衡量员工英语水平的硬指标,因此,考取四、六级证书不论是对大学在校生或是在职人员都显得尤为重要。

CET考试的地位是举足轻重的。在大学里,广为流传着这样一句话:"四、六级证书不是万能的,但没有四、六级证书却是万万不能的!"上学时没有四、六级证书就无法取得学位,甚至无法毕业,找工作时到处又都是要求英语有四、六级证书。因此,对于那些即将或刚刚踏上职业生涯的学子们,四、六级证书就是他们的职场驾照!

六级考试分为六种基本题型:1. 听力理解部分;2. 阅读理解部分;3. 词语用法和语法结构部分;4. 完形填空部分;5. 综合改错部分;6. 短文写作部分。另外,对于优秀的考生,还要进行口语考试。事实上,这六种基本题型都需要考生有很好的词汇基础,词汇的重要性是不言而喻的。

相对于以往各种词汇书籍,本书具有以下特点。

- 1. 音标:音标是语音学上用来标音的一套符号,是单词记忆的有效工具。对于任何一个单词来说,尤其是要求熟练掌握的词,了解它的读音有助于记忆。例如 absurd /əbˈsəxd /,通过它的音标我们很容易记住。ab-发/əb/的音,-surd 发/səxd/的音。
- 3. 例句:例句能帮助考生更好地掌握单词的内涵,掌握语言交际及写作中的准确运用技巧,而且它还可以帮助考生增加阅读量,扩大词汇量,增强在阅读中识

别和理解非重点词的能力。例如单词 absurd 的例句: Their request is absurd.

- 4. 辨析:辨析部分不仅包括与该单词意思相近的词的辨析,还包括该单词的一些常用搭配的辨析。词类的辨析在词汇题中占有很大的比重,该部分可以帮助考生弄清它们在不同的上下文中的用法,以便在做题时选出正确的答案。例如单词 absurd,与之意思相近的词有三个:foolish,silly,ridiculous。absurd 强调不符合人情或常识的;foolish 强调缺乏智慧和判断力的;silly 强调单纯、糊涂、低能的;ridiculous 意为荒谬的、令人发笑的,常会有鄙视之意。
- 5. 练习:一些单词后面有若干道练习题,这不仅能加深考生对该词的理解,还有助于考生灵活地运用该词。例如单词 invariably,有两道练习题:



In April 1956, Khruschev and Bulganin visited Britain. Nominally Bulganin was the head of the Soviet delegation and Khruschev was the only one of the members of the delegation.
