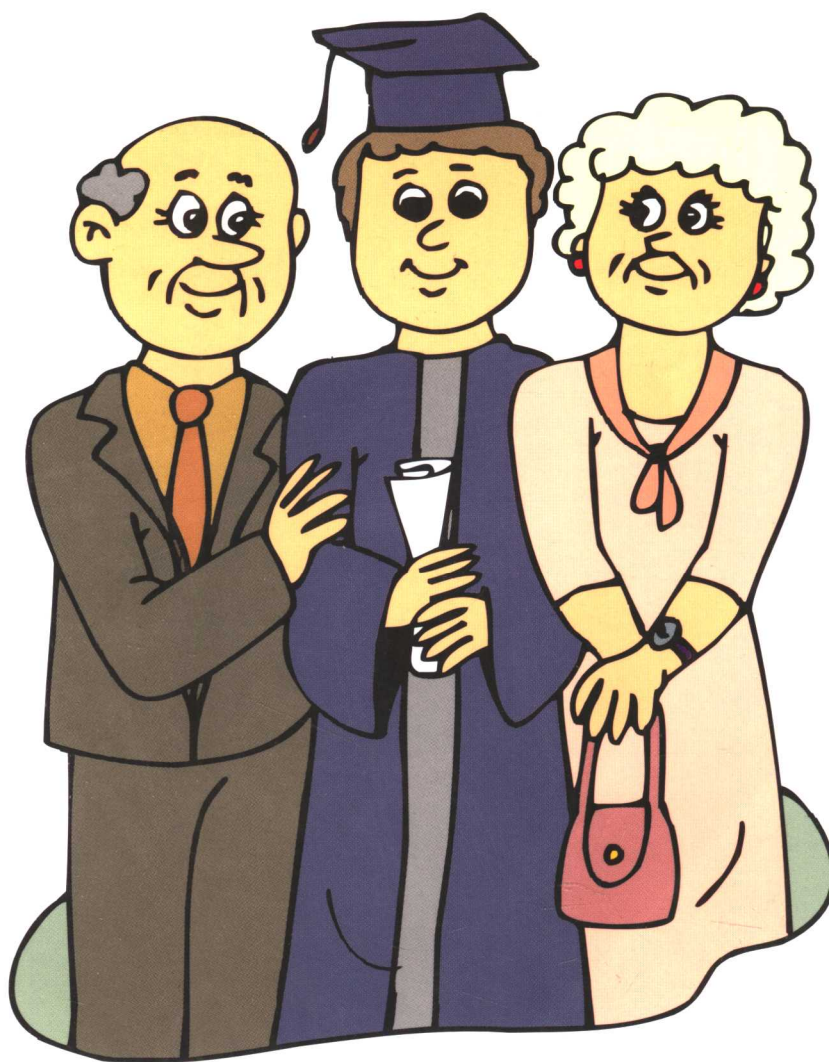

编者的话

教育部2004年1月印发的《大学英语课程教学要求(试行)》指出,大学英语的教学目标是培养学生的英语综合应用能力,特别是听说能力,使他们在今后的工作和社会交往中能用英语有效地进行口头和书面的信息交流,同时增强其自主学习能力、提高综合文化素养,以适应我国经济发展和国际交流的需要。根据《大学英语课程教学要求》所定的教学目标,我们编写了这本大学英语四六级考试听力强化训练试题集,专供学习大学英语课程的在校学生使用。

测试不能代替教学,但若应用得法,则可以促进教学。在本书的编写过程中,我们将《大学英语课程教学要求(试行)》和《全国大学英语四、六级考试改革方案(试行)》对听力教学和考试两方面的要求和规定细化到了本书的试卷内容和形式中,把大学英语听力课程的要点和难点都尽可能地融入各份试卷。

鉴于大学英语四六级考试将把听力理解部分的比例提高到35%,并将选用对话、讲座、广播电视节目等更具真实性的材料,据此本书已在选材、题量和编排等方面均作了充分的考虑,并在试题中包含了“长对话”、“短文听写”等新的测试内容。

本套书分四级、六级两册,四级内容为三大部分:(一)大学英语四级考试听力试题练习;(二)参考答案;(三)听力测试录音文字稿。六级内容同样为三大部分:(一)大学英语六级考试听力试题练习;(二)参考答案;(三)听力测试录音文字稿。试题难度基本与全国大学英语四六级考试的同级要求相当。

本书编者在编写过程中,请了复旦大学余建中、梁正溜两位教授作顾问,部分试题得到了在复旦大学任教的外籍教师的审阅与润色,特在此一并致谢。
