#### 内容提要

本书分上下两册,涵盖了高中阶段至 GRE 考试需要掌握的全部英语词汇,并按高考,大学英语四级、六级,PETS-5,TOEFL,英语专业八级,研究生人学考试及 GRE 的难度顺序进行编排。英语词汇量在3 000单词以上的学习者,可根据自己的实际情况分别突击词汇量 4 000 至12 000的英语单词,从而可以在短时间内为不同阶段的学习和考试作好充分的准备。下册涵盖8 000到10 000以上词汇。

#### 前 宣

在外语学习中,词汇量的增加至关重要,而这种增加又是分阶 段的。高考前词汇量应达到 5 000 左右基本词汇,大学英语四级 和六级考试词汇量分别为7000与8000左右;英语专业的四、八 级考试词汇量则分别为 8 000 与 10 000; PETS-5 约为 8 000; TOEFL 则为9000左右;研究生入学考试与剑桥英语考试在10000左右; 而 GRE 的词汇量需达到 11 000 到 12 000。这些考试构成了我国 英语学习者学习过程中重要的阶段和里程碑。取得考试的成功, 才能为今后的发展铺平道路。此外,语言学习本身也有其内在规 律。学习难度由浅入深,词汇也由基本词汇向专门词汇发展,每一 阶段需要掌握的词汇均有特定的范围。如果外语学习者不顾需要 与否,试图去记忆所有的单词,甚至生僻词汇也不放过,则会事倍 功半,大大影响学习效率。而要循序渐进地掌握这些考试和学习 所需的基本词汇,就必须有一本按难易程度或使用阶段编排的词 汇书,使读者能根据自己的词汇水平选择适合自己开始学习的层 次,然后一步一步地增加词汇量,分阶段解决最迫切的问题。而本 书的构思与编排,遵循的正是这一思路。

本书共分七部分,分别标明 4 000,5 000,6 000,7 000,8 000,9 000,10 000,实际代表 4 000,5 000,6 000,7 000,8 000 至9 000,10 000至11 000与12 000以上词汇水平。上册涵盖 4 000到 7 000词汇,下册涵盖 8 000到 10 000以上词汇。使用者可利用每一部分前安排的Qualification Test 来判断自己是否有能力完成本部分的内容。这样安排,是因为词汇学习有其自身的内在规律。如果使用的材料中生词比例过大,将对词汇记忆产生不利影响。在通过Qualification test 后,就可以每天做一套练习,并记忆每套练习后

面的同义词及其词义,每三天将前面学习的内容复习一次,十天后再集中复习一次已经学习的词汇,完成这一部分后再重复做一次练习,力求掌握全部涉及的词汇。通常,一个月左右可消化一部分的内容(后面三部分耗时分别为一个半月)。这样,在各类考试之前,花上一至两个月时间,就可以基本掌握应付特定考试的词汇。当然,这种结论是以考生已掌握了前面层次的考试所需的词汇为前提的。

本书从构思到编写花了四年的时间。首先,确定各级词汇必须有科学依据。我们因此而研究了国内外的词频辞典和相关资料。同时,还研究了各级考试大纲所规定的词汇。在此基础上,我们力图让读者读到地道新颖的句子,同时也是各类题材的材料中真实可信的原句,因而未采用任何一本国内外已有的词汇练习书中的习题,而是从权威词典和真实素材中编写全新的练习。这样做虽然耗时耗力,但能奉上一本令读者满意的实用而又有新意的词汇大全是我们最大的满足。

本书取名为《阶梯式英语词汇》,其内容也的确是为各阶段的英语学习或各阶段的英语考试准备的必备词汇。拥有这本书,并根据需要进行短时间的突击,定能让使用者感到得心应手。当然,词汇掌握要求的是多次反复和各种手段配合,听说与阅读均为重要的补充、巩固词汇的方法。学习者应兼顾,才能达到最佳学习效果。

愿读者在词汇学习上事半功倍,沿着这条陡峭的阶梯,一步步 登上成功的顶峰。
