



INTRODUCTION TO THE FOURTH EDITION

The topic of civil injuries or torts continues to be in the forefront of civil practice. In this fourth edition of *Tort Law for Paralegals*, the author has again updated the materials to reflect new trends in the law and technology while continuing to emphasize bedrock principles of tort law. The author continues to provide in-depth discussion of civil injuries law while giving the paralegal student a solid foundation in the practicalities of daily legal work. The reader is introduced to the important concepts of negligence, intentional torts, products liability, and business torts. However, the author also places great emphasis on the practical aspects of tort law, including understanding how law firms function, assessing cases for settlement value, investigating claims, billing hours, and evaluating automobile insurance policies, among many other topics.

As in previous editions, the author has provided a hypothetical case which is used to illustrate various points. The case involves a collision between a car and a train, resulting in the death of a passenger and severe, permanent injuries to the driver. Discussions about the case help develop the differences in civil injury law among the various jurisdictions. A complete file on this case is also provided in the appendix.
