在词汇试题详解部分,详细列出了每个单词的不同意思(一般本书所测试的意思放在第一义)和句型,并给出了丰富的例句说明各义的用法。语法试题是按语法类别划分的;在详解部分,每类语法题的最后都对该类语法作了小结性的集中介绍。在"词汇索引"部分,可以查找到历年所考过的四、六级词汇。这样,通过做试题和阅读详解,可使读者对所考过的四、六级词汇及语法有充分的理解,并牢固掌握。

需要强调的是·本书所有试题全是从 1992 年至 2001 年历年考过的四级试题、六级试题和硕士研究生试题中摘录的全真题,没有自编题。所收录四级词汇试题是历年考过的四级词汇试题以及历年的六级试题和考研试题中所含有的四级词汇试题;所收六级词汇试题是历年考过的六级试题和考研试题中所含有的四级词汇试题和考研试题里的语法试题部分是从历年四级试题、六级试题和考研试题里的语法试题中收集的·包含了常考的各重要语法项目·其中重点是虚拟语气,考试频度最大;其次是时态、比较级、强调句、让步状语从句、附加疑问句、分词短语及分词独立结构作状语等以及其他常考句别结构。

试题详解部分是本书的重点。词汇与语法试题详解内容丰富,提供了大量的四、六级词汇和用法及语法方面的综合翔实信息,考生不仅要做试题,更重要的是读详解,从详解中获取大量有用的知识信息。

另外需要指出的是,本书专为大学非英语专业本科生和硕士研究生编写。四级考生需要阅读本书,因为《教学大纲》要求非英语专业本科生在毕业前必须通过四级考试,这是对非英语专业的本科生的最低要求。六级考生当然需要阅读本书,因为本书中所收四级词汇和六级词汇都是常考词汇,现在的六级试题中的 30 题的词汇试题部分,一般包括 22 个六级词汇试题和 8 个四级词汇试题。硕士研究生考生也需要阅读本书,因为考研试题中 20 题的词汇试题部分,四级词汇约占 11—15 题,六级词汇约占 3—7 题,四、六级词汇以外的词汇约占 1—2 题;考研试题的语法部分共有10 题。因此,相信本书的出版定会对四、六级考生和硕士研究生考生提高英语测试成绩有很大帮助。
